Subject: Property Transfer of Oak Park Fire Station No. 6

## SUMMARY

This report presents a request for Agency authorization to transfer title of the Oak Park Fire Station No. 6 located at 3414 Fourth Avenue from the City of Sacramento to the Redevelopment Agency.

## BACKGROUND

In 1982 the Redevelopment Agency of the City of Sacramento authorized to act as the development agent for the subject property located in the Oak Park Redevelopment Area (Resolution No. RA-02-002). A parcel map is attached as Exhibit A.

The Agency has negotiated a tentative Disposition and Development Agreement (DDA) with John K. Holcomb and W.E. Overholtzer, a limited partnership, to redevelop the Oak Park Fire House for office use. A summary of their proposal and the terms of the agreement will be presented to you for authorization as part of a separate staff report. In order to carry out the terms of the tentative DDA which calls for the sale of the property to the developer, staff recommends that the Agency be authorized to purchase the Fire Station property. City Manager's staff is in concurrence with the proposed action.

## FINANCIAL DATA

The City of Sacramento has established a purchase price of \$12,000 for the Fire Station parcel. This price is based on an appraised land value of \$19,500 discounted to allow for the negative value of the deteriorated Fire Station structure. Estimates indicate that the cost to demolish the structure exceeds \$30,000 and that rehabilitation costs exceed \$150,000. Funds are available from cost center (A00730) - Oak Park Development Projects.

## ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

Environmental review is not required for this action.

## POLICY IMPLICATIONS

The recommended resolution is consistent with previously approved policy and no new policies are recommended.

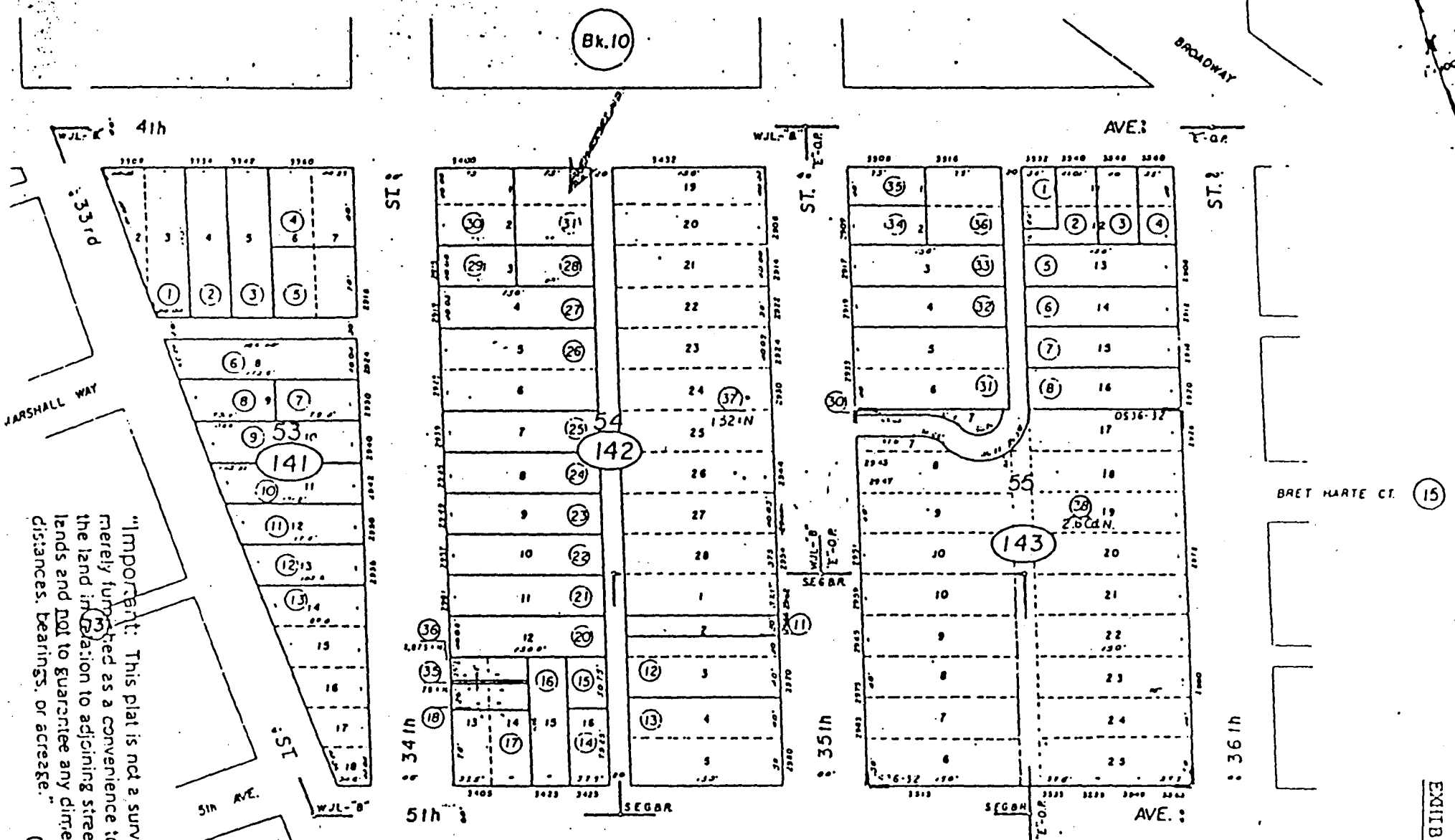
