Description/Analysis

Issue: On December 14, 2009 SMAC approved a direct purchase award in the amount of \$75,000 for a two-dimensional artwork by Gregory Kondos to be installed in International Arrivals at the Sacramento International Arrivals.

Gregory Kondos proposes a 7'x12', oil on canvas painting, titled "Sutter's Gold". The primary element in the composition is the American River running vertically through rolling hills in the heart of California Gold Rush landscape. The painting is inspired by the discovery of gold in 1848 and its historical significance to the Sacramento region. The colors, shapes, textures, and details are meant to welcome the traveler to the region, giving him or her a glimpse of what's in store beyond the International Arrivals exit. Additionally, it offers the viewer insight into the region's rich history.

Gregory Kondos made his name in landscapes and is known for azure skies and a style that borrows from abstract expressionism. He has won numerous awards, including a Lifetime Achievement Award from the 1999 International Biennale in Florence, Italy and a Master of Drawing Award from American Artists Magazine in 1996. His work is included in permanent collections around the world, including the Yosemite Museum, where he has been a member of the Artist-in-Residence Program since 1989. A retrospective at the Crocker Art Museum is among his recent solo exhibitions. Mr. Kondos received both a BA and MA in Art at the California State University at Sacramento and taught at Sacramento City College for 27 years. He was the founder and director of the campus gallery. With fellow artist and friend, Wayne Thiebaud, Mr. Kondos founded the Artists Cooperative Gallery (now the Artists Contemporary Gallery), one of the earliest showcases for aspiring artists in northern California. Mr. Kondos was recently elected to the National Academy of Design in New York and was featured in the Fall of 1998 in a PBS Special Program documentary, "A Passion for the Land."

Project budget:

Design: \$5,000 Fabrication: \$60,000 Installation/contingency: \$10,000 **Total:** \$75,000

Policy Considerations: SMAC's approval of Gregory Kondos' design proposal for the Sacramento International Airport Terminal Modernization Program (TMP), International Arrivals site meets standard APP policies and procedures and the goal of site-specific public art.

Commission/Committee Action: If SMAC approves Gregory Kondos' design proposal for the project, staff will initiate a contract for the fabrication of his artwork. APP staff will manage the installation of the artwork.

Rationale for Recommendation: The recommended design:

- Reflects a firm understanding of context/theme and exhibits original ideas.
- Relates to the architecture, and location in material and scale, is engaging and timeless.

Description/Analysis

Issue: On October 5, 2010 the Arts Commission approved a limited competition for the South Lawn public art project at the Sacramento International Airport TMP. The South Lawn competition is the final competition in Phase 2 of the Airport public art project.

The South Lawn panel meets on July 9 to select the finalists for this project. The finalists will be interviewed by the panel on or before July 30, 2010, at which time the artist will be selected for this project.

Because the Commission does not meet in August, staff recommends the Art in Public Places Committee be given the authority to approve and/or make recommendations on the panel's selection. The early approval of the artist for this project will save the project up to 6 weeks. The time savings is critical because the Airport is scheduled to open as early as October, 2011 (5 months ahead of schedule), leaving the selected artist just over a year to design, fabricate and install a major work of public art.

If approved by the APP Committee, the selected artist will be invited to create a design for the South Lawn project. The design will be brought to the Commission by October, 2010. If the Commission approves the design, the artist will have one year to fabricate and install the artwork.

Policy Considerations: APP's approval of the artist for the Sacramento International Airport TMP meets standard APP policies and procedures.

Commission/Committee Action: The Commission approved the Sacramento International Airport TMP Public Art Program Art Plan on August 11, 2008, which outlined the selection process for Phase 2 projects, including the South Lawn.

Rationale for Recommendation: To allow for public art that is integrated into the landscape, an artist needs to be under contract so that s/he may collaborate with the design team before the construction documents for the project are finalized and approved. Granting the APP Committee authority to approve the artist proposal for the south Lawn of the Sacramento International Airport (TMP) enables the artist to begin the design process up to 6 weeks sooner.

Financial Considerations: \$750,000 dollars has been allocated for the South Lawn site at the Sacramento International Airport.

Background: Sacramento International Airport Terminal Modernization Program (TMP)

Sacramento County Airport System (County Airport System) began construction on the Terminal Modernization Program (TMP) at Sacramento International Airport (International Airport) in June 2008. The TMP will include an extensive public art program, administered by the Sacramento Metropolitan Arts Commission (Commission). On March 25, 2008, the County Board of Supervisors approved a total TMP public art budget of \$8 million, including \$5 million for public art with a minimum of 25 – 30% to be expended on functional and/or integrated art.

Following approval of the TMP Art Program budget, a TMP Art Plan outlining a strategic plan for the acquisition, exhibition and maintenance of artwork at the new Central Terminal B was created and approved by the Commission on: August 11, 2008. The plan outlined an artist selection process in three phases:

Phase 1: Integrated Art

Selection Process: Limited competition

Sites: Ticket Hall, Concourse

Phase 2: Interior and Exterior Locations

Selection Process: Open competition

Sites: Various/10 sites

Phase 3: Parking Garage

Selection Process: Open competition

The South Lawn Competition is part of the Phase 2 Artist selection process. It is for a major work of art in the South Lawn area of the airport. The South Lawn is a 9-acre landscaped garden that connects to, and is publicly accessible from, the domestic bag claim area. It is visible from the south-facing windows of the Airport's Landside building and is designed to serve both passengers and Airport/Airline staff. It will also be used for press conferences and other public events. This site will be the most visible in the entire airport complex.

The South Lawn provides an opportunity to commission a monumental work of art which may be a work of earth art or environmental art (a broad-based art form in which artists use the landscape as a medium to make art), sculpture, and/or installation, in a scale large enough to be viewed from the Terminal as well as from the roadway. The commissioned artist should be highly experienced.

Description/Analysis

Issue: On March 8, 2010, a limited competition selection process was approved by the Arts Commission to facilitate a fast tracked approach of getting an artist under contract in time to collaborate with the design team to integrate the art into the building's exterior façade. On May 10, 2010, the Arts Commission granted the Art in Public Places Committee authority to approve the artist for Fire Station #43 in an effort to accommodate the aggressive project schedule mandated by the City Manager's office. On May 20, 2010, the Art in Public Places Committee approved Brian Goggin as the artist for Fire Station #43.

Brian Goggin will present his proposal to the Fire Station #43 panel in July, 2010. The August 9 Commission meeting may be postponed until September 13, 2010. If the APP Committee is given the authority to approve the panel's recommendation, then at least 3 weeks and possibly as much as 8 weeks of time will be saved, which is a significant step toward accommodating a fast tracked schedule. The Commission will see the design on September 13th.

Brian Goggin was born in Pomona, California and lives and works in San Francisco, California. He earned a Bachelor of Arts from California State University, San Francisco where he graduated Magna Cum-Laude. Brian has created public art for the Seattle Arts Commission and King County Arts Commission in Washington, and in California for the Oakland Art Museum, San Francisco Arts Commission, San Jose Museum of Art, Sunnyvale Arts Commission, and Menlo Park Arts Commission. He was commissioned by SMAC to create "Samson", a suitcase sculpture for baggage claim in Terminal B of the Sacramento International Airport. In 2009 Brian was awarded the Americans for the Arts award for the most exemplary, innovative permanent or temporary public art work created or debuted in 2008. He creates site specific multimedia sculpture often with whimsical, unexpected elements.

Policy Considerations: APP's approval of Brian Goggin's design proposal for Fire Station #43 meets standard APP policies and procedures and the goal of site-specific public art.

Environmental Considerations: None

Rationale for Recommendation: To allow for public art that is integrated into the building's architecture, an artist needs to be under contract so that he may collaborate with the design team before the construction documents for the exterior façade are finalized and approved. Granting the APP Committee authority to approve Brian Goggin's design proposal for Fire Station 43 enables staff to initiate the artist's fabrication and installation contract process 3 weeks sooner.

Financial Considerations: Funding for the public art collection for this project is \$126,574 and a funding line has been established: Sub-CIP F13000704.
