Subject: Grant: Gang Violence Suppression (GVS) Multi-component Program

Location/Council District: Districts 4, 6, & 8

Recommendation:

Adopt a Resolution to: 1) authorize the City Manager to accept a grant award for \$500,000 in funding from the State of California, Office of Emergency Services (OES), and 2) increase the Police Department's Grant Operating and Grant Revenue Budgets in the amount of \$500,000.

Summary:

The Sacramento Police Department (SPD) is recommending authorization to accept a grant award of \$500,000 from the State of California, OES, for a one-year period starting July 1, 2005 and ending June 30, 2006. The program includes feeder and attendance areas for Hiram Johnson High School, Luther Burbank High School and C. K. McClatchy High School, which are part of the Sacramento City Unified School District.

Committee/Commission Action: None.

Background Information:

The GVS Program has been in existence since July 1, 1998. The program is a continuation of a collaborative effort between the SPD, Sacramento County Probation Department, Sacramento County District Attorney's Office, Sacramento City Unified School District and two community based organizations: La Familia and Another Choice Another Chance.

Within the GVS program, law enforcement components work together to identify gang members and suppress gang activity. The District Attorney vertically prosecutes

offenders.¹ The school district and community-based organizations offer referrals and counseling. All six of the partners coordinate gang awareness and education training.

Financial Considerations:

The total project cost is \$550,000, which includes a required 10% state funds match from each of the six individual agencies. The Police Department's award portion is \$96,391 for sworn labor and \$7,500 for administration/audit costs. The City's portion of the 10% match is \$10,389, which will be provided from a realignment of the Police Department's General Fund approved operating budget.

The following table is a breakdown of how the Gang Violence Suppression Multi-Component Program grant funds will be allocated:

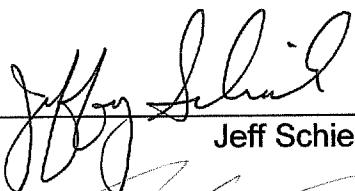
Policy Considerations:

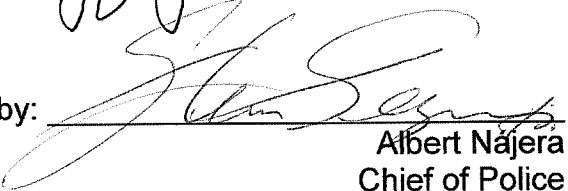

¹ Vertical prosecution occurs when the prosecutor who makes the initial filing or appearance in a gang-related case performs all subsequent court appearances on that particular case through its conclusion, including the sentencing phase, eliminating the sporadic involvement of numerous prosecutors in the case.

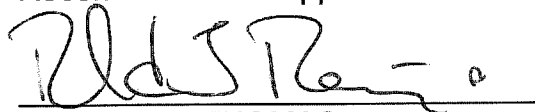
Emerging Small Business Development (ESBD):

ACCEPTANCE OF GRANT FUNDING FROM THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA, OFFICE OF EMERGENCY SERVICES (OES) FOR THE GANG VIOLENCE SUPPRESSION (GVS) MULTI-COMPONENT PROGRAM

BACKGROUND

- A. The City of Sacramento has received a grant award of \$500,000 from the State of California, Office of Emergency Services for the continuation of the Gang Violence Suppression (GVS) Multi-component Program in FY2006.
- B. The program is a continuation of a collaborative effort between the SPD, Sacramento County Probation Department, Sacramento County District Attorney's Office, Sacramento City Unified School District and two community based organizations: La Familia and Another Choice Another Chance.
- C. Acceptance of the grant requires a 10% match of \$50,000, the cost of which will be shared by the GVS program participants based on the amount of the grant funds allocated to each program participant.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City Manager, or designated representative, is hereby authorized to accept a grant award on behalf of the City of Sacramento, from the State of California, Office of Emergency Services, which totals \$500,000, including any future extensions, agreements, modifications or attachments thereof.

Section 2. The grant revenue budget will be increased by:
