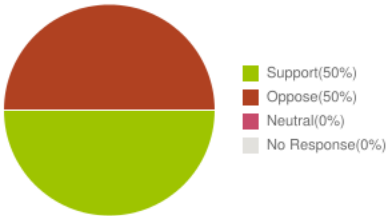

Overall Sentiment



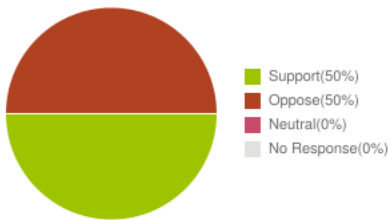

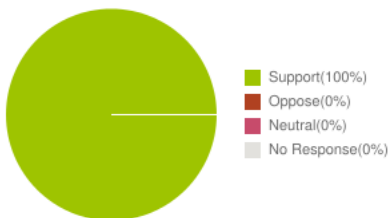

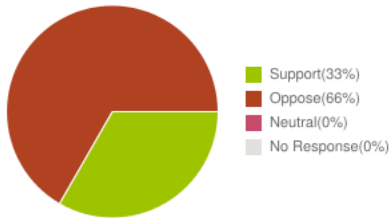
