SUBJECT: RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF PROPOSITION 85
CALIFORNIA LIBRARY CONSTRUCTION AND
RENOVATION BOND ACT OF 1988.

SUMMARY

Request that the City Council adopt a Resolution in support of Proposition 85, the California Library Construction and Renovation Bond Act of 1988.

BACKGROUND

Governor George Deukmejian signed Senate Bill 181 (Chapter 49), the Library Construction and Renovation Bond Act of 1988.

This measure will provide financing for library repair, renovation and construction projects. State bonds will provide 65 percent funding and the recipient will provide 35 percent matching funds.

This measure was placed on the November 8, 1988 general election ballot as Proposition 85.


The adoption of the Resolution in support of Proposition 85 has no financial impact on the City of Sacramento.

RECOMMENDATION


It is recommended that the City Council approve this Resolution. This item was heard and approved by the Law and Legislation Committee on October 20, 1988.

RESOLUTION NO. 88-942

ADOPTED BY THE SACRAMENTO CITY COUNCIL ON DATE OF

A RESOLUTION TO SUPPORT PASSAGE OF PROPOSITION 85,
CALIFORNIA LIBRARY CONSTRUCTION AND RENOVATION BOND ACT OF 1988

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

WHEREAS the public library is an enduring and important resource to people of all ages, races and economic backgrounds and needs to be preserved.

WHEREAS many public library facilities are unsafe, inaccessible and inadequate to provide needed services to their communities.

WHEREAS a state/local financial partnership is needed since local public libraries do not have the funds to remedy this problem of deteriorating and inadequate library facilities.

WHEREAS the California Library Construction and Renovation Bond Act of 1988 will appear as Proposition 85 on the statewide ballot in November 1988 and, if adopted, would create a grant program to construct and renovate local public libraries.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of Sacramento that the Council support Proposition 85, the California Library Construction and Renovation Bond Act of 1988, which authorizes the issuance of \$75 million in state general obligation bonds for the purpose of financing a library construction and renovation program.
