Description/Analysis:

Issue: The City limit line is the centerline of Sheldon Road. The City of Sacramento's jurisdiction is north of the centerline. Both agencies agree that a maintenance agreement is necessary to outline responsibilities for maintaining the joint facilities along Sheldon Road between State Route 99 and Bruceville Road, and how reimbursement is to occur. The proposed maintenance agreement provides for the City of Elk Grove to maintain the pavement surface, median landscaping, traffic signals, traffic signs and markings and hazardous materials response along the roadway, with the City of Sacramento providing annual reimbursement to the City of Elk Grove for the City of Sacramento's fair share of costs. Each entity will be responsible for maintaining roadside landscaping and street lights within its respective jurisdictions.


Policy Considerations: The action requested herein is consistent with how the City of Sacramento has administered maintenance of joint facilities with other local agencies.

Environmental Considerations: Approving an agreement is not considered a project as defined by Section 15378(a) of the California Environmental Quality Act guidelines. The recommended action involves no physical construction and has no potential to cause significant impact to the environment.

Rationale for Recommendation: Approval of the Agreement with the City of Elk Grove documents specific responsibilities for the maintenance of joint facilities along Sheldon Road between SR 99 and Bruceville Road.

Financial Considerations: The annual maintenance costs paid by the City of Sacramento to the City of Elk Grove will be offset with Citywide Landscape and Lighting District funds (Fund 2232) and Gas Tax funds (Fund 2002) within the Department of Transportation Street Maintenance Operating Budget. There are no general funds planned or allocated to this agreement.

Emerging Small Business Development (ESBD): The City of Elk Grove will follow a formal procurement process that will allow small businesses to provide services covered by this maintenance agreement.

**MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF ELK GROVE AND CITY OF
SACRAMENTO FOR JOINT TRANSPORTATION FACILITIES ALONG SHELDON
ROAD BETWEEN STATE ROUTE 99 AND BRUCEVILLE ROAD**

BACKGROUND
