Adopted by The Sacramento City Council on date of

WHEREAS, on August 21 1942, the City Council called for bids on approximatly five hundred (500) tons of sulphuric acid, and

WHEREAS, the call for bids was advertised in accordance with law and Section 251 of the Charter of the City of Sacramento, the bids to be presented to the Council on August 28 1942, and


WHEREAS, no bids for the supplying of the sulphuric acid were received,

That the supply of sulphuric acid be purchased in open market by the City Manager, and he is hereby authorized and directed to make the purchase.
