The Honorable City Council met in Regular Session on this date at 8.45 o'clock, Mayor Elkus presiding and Roll Call being answered by following members of City Council:-

Anderson, Bidwell, Brown, Elkus, Frazier, Goddard, Kiernan, John H. Miller, Royal Miller.

The Minutes of Regular Meeting of October 23rd, 1924 were read and approved.

In accordance with recommendation of City Manager, Councilman Kiernan moved that Pool and Billiard License be granted George E. Herbert for premises 2668 Sacramento Boulevard. Seconded by Councilman Goddard and carried by following vote:

Councilman Kiernan moved that specifications presented by City Manager on this date with approval, for sheet metal work for portion of new city wharf now under construction be adopted and bids received November 6th, 1924, between hour of 8.15 and 9.15 o'clock P. RESOLUTION ORDERING WORK NO. 1933.

"RESOLVED, that the public interest and convenience require, and the City Council of the City of Sacramento hereby orders the following street work to be done, to-wit:

"The improvement of the following streets, avenues and rights-of-way, in the City of Sacramento, to-wit:

"42nd Street from a point 4 feet north of the center line of 14th Avenue to a point 8 feet south of the center line of 12th Avenue;

"12th Avenue from a point 8 feet east of the center line of 42nd Street to a point 8 feet east of the center line of 40th Street (south of 12th Avenue);

"40th Street from the center line of 12th Avenue to a point 4 feet north of the center line of 14th Avenue;

"45th Street from a point 4 feet north of the center line of 14th Avenue to the manhole in place in the alley first north of 14th Avenue;

"46th Street from a point 4 feet north of the center line of 14th Avenue to the manhole in place in the alley first north of 14th Avenue;

"53rd Street from the manhole in place on 5th Avenue to a point 4 feet north of the center line of 14th Avenue;

"11th Avenue from the center line of 53rd Street to a point 8 feet east of the center line of 52nd Street;

"52nd Street from a point 8 feet north of the center line of 11th Avenue to a point 3 feet south of the center line of the alley first north of 14th Avenue;

"The right-of-way first north of 10th Avenue, owned by the City of Sacramento, from the center line of 53rd Street to a point 630 feet easterly therefrom; and

"11th Avenue from the center line of 53rd Street to a point 550 feet easterly therefrom; to the extent, with the materials and in the manner set forth in Resolution of Intention No.1933, passed and adopted by said City Council on October 9th, 1924 reference to which Resolution of Intention is hereby made for a description of said work and improvement, and of the district to be assessed for the costs and expenses of said work.

"The City Clerk is hereby directed to post conspicuously for five (5) days on or near the Council Chamber door of the City Council notice hereof, with specifications, inviting sealed proposals or bids for doing said work; and to publish twice a notice hereof, inviting sealed proposals or bids for doing said work, and referring to the specifications posted and on file, the said publication to be in the Sacramento Star, a daily newspaper published and circulated in said City of Sacramento and hereby designated for that purpose.

"All such proposals or bids shall be received by the City Clerk, at the Council Chamber of the City Council, in the City Hall of said City, on the 20th day of November, 1924 between the hour of 8.00 o'clock P. M., and the hour of 9.00 o'clock P. M., and said day is hereby designated as the day on which at the hour of 9.00 o'clock P. M., the said proposals or bids shall be opened, all of which shall be specified in said notice, and said notice shall require with said proposals or bids a check certified by a responsible bank, payable to the City of Sacramento, for an amount not less than ten per cent (10%) of the aggregate of the proposal, or by a bond for the said amount, and so payable signed by the bidder and two sureties, all as prescribed by law.

Councilman Anderson moved that foregoing Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Councilman Kiernan and carried by following vote:

AYES: Anderson, Bidwell, Brown, Elkus, Frazier, Goddard, Kiernan, John H. Miller, Royal Miller.

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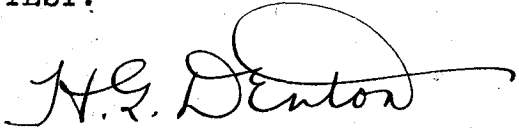
