DECEMBER 20, 1951

WHEREAS, this municipal wharf is extensively used by Sacramento area shippers in inter-coastal, coastwise and foreign commerce, and

WHEREAS, intercoastal steamship lines have applied terminal or base rates from the municipal wharf in Sacramento to Atlantic coast ports continuously since April 1933, and

WHEREAS, the lawfulness of these Sacramento terminal rates was determined in 1935 and confirmed in 1939, and

WHEREAS, numerous Sacramento industries have enlarged their plant facilities and numerous new and modern plants have been constructed as a result of this confirmed parity of intercoastal freight rates, and

WHEREAS, on December 7, 1951 all intercoastal steamship lines serving the Port of Sacramento eastbound to Atlantic coast ports filed a tariff with the Interstate Commerce Commission effective January 15, 1952 which cancelled the Port of Sacramento, including the municipal wharf from its tariff, and

WHEREAS, cancellation of this parity of freight rates after being in effect many years will definitely adversely affect the food processing industry and industry in general and retard industrial growth in the Sacramento area in the future, and

WHEREAS, the Federal Government has spent several millions of dollars in maintaining and improving the Sacramento River channel,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City of Sacramento in the interest of the public welfare and in the interest of economic development in the Sacramento area petition the Interstate Commerce Commission requesting that the tariff filed by intercoastal steamship lines effective January 15, 1952, insofar as the provisions thereof result in the cancellation of the said existing intercoastal rates from Sacramento to Atlantic coast ports, be suspended, pending full and complete investigation of the reasonableness and lawfulness thereof.
