

ORDINANCE NO. 2058, FOURTH SERIES

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ANNEXATION OF CERTAIN TERRITORY KNOWN AS "65TH STREET AND 14TH AVENUE AREA" TO THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO, AND MAKING THIS AN EMERGENCY MEASURE TO TAKE EFFECT IMMEDIATELY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

SECTION 1. That the annexation to the City of Sacramento, a municipal corporation, of all that certain territory known as "65TH STREET AND 14TH AVENUE AREA" situate in the County of Sacramento, State of California, contiguous to said City and which is hereinafter described, all in accordance with the provisions of the Annexation Act of 1913, as amended, and also pursuant to an election duly and regularly held within the said territory on the 17th day of June, 1958, at which election a majority of all of the votes cast by the qualified electors therein were in favor of the annexation of said territory to the City of Sacramento, be, and the same is hereby approved and allowed. And by reason of the aforesaid premises, the said territory is by this ordinance declared annexed to, incorporated in and made a part of the City of Sacramento, a municipal corporation, for all purposes.

That the outer boundaries of "65TH STREET AND 14TH AVENUE AREA" hereby annexed, is particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point on the City Limits line of the City of Sacramento, said point being located at the intersection of the center line of Folsom Boulevard and the westerly right-of-way line of the Central Pacific Railroad; thence generally southerly along the westerly right-of-way line of said Central Pacific Railroad to another point on the City Limits line of the City of Sacramento; said point being the northeast corner of Lot Number fifty-two (52) as shown on the official "Map of Colonial Acres No. 4," recorded in the office of the County Recorder of Sacramento County, California, June 29, 1926, in Book 19 of Maps, Map No. 2; thence generally westerly and northerly along the City Limits of the City of Sacramento to the point of beginning.

SECTION 2. That the area above described shall be taxed equally with the property within the City of Sacramento for the payment of its pro rata share of the outstanding bonded indebtedness of the City as of June 30, 1958, as approved by the voters in accordance with Section 35147 of the Government Code.

SECTION 3. That said area shall become a part of the Sacramento Unified School District, all in accordance with the provisions of Section 2421.5 of the Education Code.

SECTION 4. That this ordinance shall be published once in the "SACRAMENTO UNION," a newspaper of general circulation, the official newspaper of the City of Sacramento.

SECTION 5. That pursuant to the provisions of Section 26 of the City Charter, authorizing the Council to enact emergency measures to take effect immediately, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect immediately; such emergency being the need for police protection within the area.
