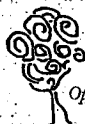

SUMMARY:

The Urban Recreational and Cultural Centers grant is one of several grants under Proposition 12 (2000 Bond Act). This grant is the only Proposition 12 grant that requires all submitted projects to be nominated by the State Legislature. Ten potential projects for this grant were gathered citywide and are contained herein.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The Urban Recreation and Cultural Centers grant program under Proposition 12, is limited to development or rehabilitation projects consisting of urban recreational and cultural centers, museums, and facilities for wildlife education or environmental education. Potential projects will interpret one or more important California historical, cultural, economic, technological or resource themes in major regions of California. California State Parks will give the highest priority to projects whose themes are not interpreted in any existing museum or that have demonstrable deficiencies in their presentation in an existing museum.
