

Reports relating to current practices and policies in these areas were presented to the Board members by the Secretary, along with a cost estimate for a night shift premium pay policy.

After considerable discussion, it was the order of the Board that hearings should be held later in the month with employees, employee representatives, supervisors and department heads to consider any suggestions for changes in current policies and to consider the feasibility of installing a night shift premium pay plan.

REQUEST FOR SALARY ADJUSTMENT:
Supervising Plant Operator

Communication from Roger Ekar, Business Representative of Local No. 39 of the International Union of Operating Engineers, dated March 27, 1967, requesting a salary adjustment for the class of Supervising Plant Operator, was considered.

Mr. Ekar appeared before the Board to outline reasons for the request and presented a communication from Elmer Herr, Waste Water Treatment Plant Superintendent, in which he recommended that the salary range for Supervising Plant Operator be adjusted upward to a level between the salary ranges for Sanitary Chemist I and Sanitary Chemist II.

Upon recommendation of the Secretary, action on the request was deferred pending further study.
