

## RESOLUTION No. NO. 394

Adopted by The Sacramento City Council on date of

October 7th, 1938.

WHEREAS, the City of Sacramento has increased in population and in populated area in the past few years, and


WHEREAS, every effort is now being made and has been made to minimize every type of hazard that could cause injury to the people of our City, and

WHEREAS, by reason of said increase in population and populated area it now becomes evident that the Emergency Hospital and the Emergency Ambulance service conducted by the City of Sacramento could be made more effective by the establishment of an additional Emergency Hospital in the vicinity of what is known as the Oak Park District and by the placing of a skilled medical attendant on the Emergency Ambulance;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Manager and the Health Officer be requested to present to this Council a report on the expense and feasibility of establishing a branch Emergency Hospital and placing skilled medical service on the City Emergency Ambulance.
