SUBJECT: 65TH STREET EXPRESSWAY BUS STOP IMPROVEMENTS (PN:TJ16) - PROJECT
CONSTRUCTION APPROVAL AND BID ADVERTISEMENT

LOCATION/COUNCIL DISTRICT: 65th Street at 18th Avenue/21st Avenue/Fruitridge Road/Lemon
Hill Avenue/Elder Creek Road
District No. 6

SUMMARY

This report requests that the City Council approve project construction and authorize bid advertisement for 65th Street Expressway Bus Stop Improvements. This project will provide curb, gutter, sidewalk and drainage improvements for bus stops along 65th Street at 18th Avenue, 21st Avenue, Fruitridge Road, Lemon Hill Avenue and Elder Creek Road.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

This report recommends that the City Council approve the plans and specifications for this project and authorize the City Clerk to advertise for bids to be received on January 13, 1993.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

This project will provide curb, gutter, sidewalk and drainage improvements for bus stops along 65th Street at 18th Avenue, 21st Avenue, Fruitridge Road, Lemon Hill Avenue and Elder Creek Road. The average length of improvements at each location is 110 feet. The improvements will be installed in existing right of ways and none will be bus turnouts. There is existing curb and gutter at some of the project locations. The project improvements will provide adequate pedestrian and bus access, improve safety and complement the visual impact of the project locations.

A Categorical Exemption for this project was filed with the County Clerk of the County of Sacramento on November 13, 1992.

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FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

The engineer's estimated construction cost is \$115,000. The estimated total project cost, including all planning, design and construction costs, is \$155,000. The current budget is \$379,496, which was approved in the Capital Improvement Program from the Major Streets fund (209) and the Capital Grants fund (248). The funds available for this project amount to \$279,133, as of November 24, 1992.

A non-refundable fee of \$15.00 will be charged for each set of plans and specifications to cover reproduction costs.

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

This action is consistent with Chapter 58, Article III, Section 58.301 of the City Code concerning advertisement for bids.

MBE/WBE


