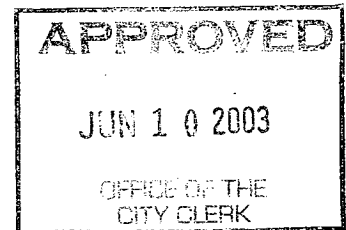

SUBJECT: PROPOSED ON-STREET PARKING FEES

LOCATION AND COUNCIL DISTRICT:

Citywide. All districts.

RECOMMENDATION:

This report recommends that the City Council adopt the attached resolution amending the City of Sacramento Fee and Charge Report establishing the schedule of parking fees pursuant to Title 10 of the Sacramento City Code.

SUMMARY:

Short-term parking meter fees were last changed in 1995. Since that time, parking meters have been installed in Old Sacramento with a higher fee than in the rest of the City. Parking congestion is increasing and customers of downtown businesses are having difficulty finding street parking. There is a wide variance between the fees charged for on-street parking and those charged in the City's parking garages. The proposed parking meter fees (Exhibit A) will provide for one consistent fee throughout the City and be closer to those charged in the parking garages.

Other on-street parking meter fees have not changed since 1989 and do not cover the actual cost of providing services. It estimated that annual On-Street Parking revenues will increase by \$260,000 with the adoption of the recommended fees effective July 1, 2003.

SUBJECT: PROPOSED SCHEDULE OF PARKING PENALTIES

LOCATION AND COUNCIL DISTRICT:

City-wide. All districts.

RECOMMENDATION:

This report recommends that the City Council adopt the attached resolution amending the City of Sacramento Fee and Charge Report establishing the schedule of parking penalties and administrative fees pursuant to Title 10 of the Sacramento City Code and the California Vehicle Code.

FOR CITY COUNCIL MEETING OF: June 10, 2003

SUMMARY:

The City Council has the authority to set parking penalties for both Sacramento City Codes (SCC) and California Vehicle Codes (CVC). The recommended increases in parking penalties (Exhibit A) effective July 1, 2003, will be an effective deterrent to repeat violations and be in line with those for Sacramento County. It is estimated that annual revenues will increase by \$885,000. City parking penalties were last increased in 1995.
