SUBJECT: Appointments to the City/County Homeless
Task Force

SUMMARY

On June 26, 1984, your Council authorized several actions pertaining to the extension of operation of the single persons shelters on Front Street. At that time, several representatives of the business community requested that consideration be given to appointing some business representatives to the Homeless Task Force. This report forwards their nominations for your consideration.

BACKGROUND

At the time that the testimony was received, it was noted that only seven vacancies existed on the Task Force (for obvious administrative reasons, the number of members has been limited to 30). It was suggested that five of the seven vacancies be assigned to business associations, with two vacancies left for other, future assignments. These five, combined with the previously appointed member from the Chamber of Commerce, would provide a total of six business members on the Task Force.

Since that time, we have communicated with the Downtown, Old Sacramento, Broadway, North Sacramento and Discovery Park merchants groups. Each has submitted a name for consideration as their representative. Four of the five have asked that an alternate also be appointed. The Task Force has recommended that for purposes of continuity, that any alternates appointed not be allowed to vote, although they would sit on the Task Force and participate fully in the discussion. This idea was presented to the business representatives who are in general

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agreement with it. Both primary and alternate nominations are indicated on the attached report. Out of fairness to the non-business representatives on the Task Force, they too should be given the opportunity to name an alternate. Some have done so, and the names have been indicated on the attached list as well.

The primary members from the City Police Department, the County Mental Health Department and the clergy have also changed. New primary members have been identified (Capt. Keith Scheile, Sacramento Police Department; Jim Brentt, County Mental Health Department; and Rev. Dean Howard Perry, Trinity Episcopal Cathedral). The Social Security Administration has also expressed their desire to participate. Their nominations (Peter D'Anna and Ken Zacher) are also attached.

POLICY IMPLICATIONS

The appointment of additional business representatives to the Task Force will provide for an input into the problems of the homeless from a segment of the community which has felt directly troubled by this problem.


RECOMMENDATION

Appoint the primary and alternate Task Force members indicated on the attached list including the five additional business representatives indicated, the three replacement representatives and the representatives from the Social Security Administration.
