SUBJECT: ACCEPTANCE OF ANNUAL FEDERAL FUNDS FOR CALIFORNIA TASK

FORCE SEVEN, URBAN SEARCH AND RESCUE (US&R) TEAM

#### **SUMMARY:**

The City of Sacramento Fire Department is the sponsoring agency for California Task Force Seven Urban Search and Rescue team (CA TF-7 US&R). On February 22, 2000 the Sacramento City Council authorized the City Manager to apply for the annual federal funding for the operation of CA-TF-7 in the amount of \$150,000. On March 9, 2000 the Fire Department was advised by the Federal Emergency Management Agency that CA TF-7's application was approved for \$150,000. It is now requested that the City Council authorize the City Manager to accept these funds.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

The CA-TF-7 team consists primarily of Sacramento Fire Department personnel, with fire personnel from the American River, Sacramento County (the newly formed Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District) El Dorado County Fire Protection Districts and the City of West Sacramento Fire Department. The Sacramento Fire Department, representing the City as the sponsoring agency, is responsible for organizing, training, equipping, maintaining the specialized equipment cache and mobilizing the team upon activation. With this year's funds, CA TF-7 anticipates addressing several

issues including purchasing of new and replacement equipment to bring CA TF-7's cache in compliance with the federal approved US&R cache list. To receive the federal US&R funds of \$150,000, we must sign the Assistance Award agreement; therefore we are requesting the authorization of the City Manager to sign the agreement. (The Assistance Award agreement is available for review in the Office of the City Clerk.)

#### FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

The Fire Department provides personnel to support the daily operations related to CA-TF-7. Estimated support of the Fire Department personnel is \$145,000 (currently absorbed in the Fire Department budget) the \$150,000 grant funding will be used to purchase supplies and equipment. No augmentation of the Fire Department budget is being requested.

#### **ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS:**

Ongoing administrative and maintenance activities, such as purchase of supplies, equipment, or materials which are not made for purposes of a public works construction project, do not constitute a "project" and are exempt from California Environmental Quality Act. CEQA Guidelines, Section 15061 (b) (1), 15378(b)(3).

#### **POLICY CONSIDERATION:**

Acceptance of the federal US&R grant is consistent with City Council actions related to state and federal grant awards.

#### **ESBD EFFORT:**

Staff will follow the emerging and small business guideline when purchasing supplies or services under this grant.
