Gary Costamagna, Deputy Fire Chief, presented a brief overview of the Multi-Hazard Emergency Plan. He explained that the plan provides guidelines for responding to hazards the City might reasonably expect to encounter. Examples of scenarios outlined in the plan include flooding, earthquake, tornado, nuclear defense and terrorist incidents. Deputy Chief Costamagna said the plan should be used as a management tool as it does not provide specific instructions.

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Deputy Chief Costamagna and Fire Captain Ed Woods responded to questions from Committee members. Public Information Officer Christine Olsen described the aspects of the plan dealing with public information dissemination. In response to a question from the Chair, Ms. Olsen indicated that two community meetings will be held in each City Council district with a program put on by the Red Cross.

It was MOVED by Committee member Ferris and SECONDED by Committee member Kastanis to approve staff recommendation. The vote in favor was unanimous.

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The meeting was adjourned at 1:55 pm.
