SUBJECT: SUMP 128 EMERGENCY GENERATOR AND AUTOMATIC TRANSFER SWITCH INSTALLATION (PN: WH36) - CONTRACT AWARD TO BRC CONSTRUCTION, FOR AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$178,558

LOCATION AND COUNCIL DISTRICT:

The construction funded by this contract will affect Sump 128 which is located at Mack Road and Morrison Creek within Council District 8, see enclosed map.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the City Council adopt the attached resolution, based on the City's current MBE/WBE policy which:

Accepts the responsive low bid from BRC Construction in the amount of \$178,558 and awards the contract.

SUMMARY

Bids were received and opened by the City Clerk on November 5, 1997; BRC Construction was the lowest responsive bidder.

Sump 128 Emergency Generator and Automatic Transfer Switch Installation - Contract Award (PN: WH36)

BACKGROUND

Sump 128 is designed to collect and pump storm drainage water into Morrison Creek. As part of the City's effort to control flooding, an emergency generator and automatic transfer switch will be installed at this location. If there is a SMUD power failure, the generator will start automatically and the automatic transfer switch will connect the generator to the pumps. This will ensure that the pumping station can pump its rated capacity throughout an extended SMUD outage.

This project was advertised and bids were received on November 5, 1997. The bids are summarized below:

- The engineer's construction estimate was \$175,000.
- Staff recommends the contract award to BRC Construction because Luppen and Hawley was non-responsive with their MBE/WBE Good Faith Effort.
- The estimated completion date is May 1, 1998.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

This project will be funded from the Storm Drainage Fund (Fund 425). The total construction cost including design, construction, inspection and contingency is \$218,306 based on the bid of \$178,558. As of November 12, 1997 the unobligated balance available for this project (425-500-WH36-4820) is \$288,011 which is sufficient for award.

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION

The Planning Services Division, Environmental Section, has reviewed the project and has determined that this project is exempt from CEQA under Section 15301(c) of the CEQA Guidelines.

A notice of categorical exemption was filed with the County Clerk on August 20, 1997.

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

This action is in conformance with City Code sections, 58.03.304, & 58.03.301, which provides that the City Council may award competitively bid contracts to the lowest responsible bidder and "advertising for bidding" requirements respectively.

MBEWBE

This project included participation goals of 10.75% MBE and 9.5% WBE as required by Resolution 93-619, relating to MBE/WBE participation goals and policies, adopted by the City Council on November 2, 1993. Award of the project is contingent upon the responsive low bidder either meeting these project MBE/WBE participation goals or making documented good faith efforts towards meeting the project goals. The responsive low bidder, BRC Construction, met the Good Faith Effort.

The low bidder, Luppen and Hawley, did not submit a Good Faith Effort and was determined by City Staff to be non-responsive. Therefore, BRC Construction became the qualified lowest bidder.

Plans and specifications were sent to nine (9) plan rooms and construction service organizations for publication and use by the construction industry of Northern California. There are four (4) organizations on the distribution list that are directly involved with the outreach to MBE/WBE contractors.

Other outreach efforts to MBE/WBE for this project included:

- Advertisement of the project on the City of Sacramento Construction Project Bid Line (916) 264-7000.
- Free access to review the project plans and specifications at the City of Sacramento, Architecture & Engineering Division Plan room at 927 10th Street.
- Provide notice of this project to three (3) minority chambers of commerce and three (3) minority and women community organizations directly involved with the outreach to MBE/WBEs.



PROTEST OF BLD AWARD

Dear City Clerk:

By this letter, Luppen & Hawley, Inc. formally protests the award of City Contract No. PN: WH36 for the Sump 128 Generator and Transfer Switch Installation Project to BRC Construction, Inc.

On November 5, 1997, Luppen & Hawley, Inc. submitted a bid for the above-referenced contract to the City of Sacramento, Department of Utilities. Upon the opening of the sealed bids, the City of Sacramento declared that Luppen & Hawley, Inc. was the low bidder. Notwithstanding its status as low bidder, Luppen & Hawley was informed, by letter dated November 20, 1997, that the Department of Utilities staff will recommend that the City Council award the the contract to BRC Construction, INc.

The Department of Utilities failed to provide any explanation for rejecting Luppen and Hawley's low bid. Consequently, Luppen & Hawley must assume that the reason for its rejection rests in its refusal to comply with the City's MBE/WBE requirements set forth in City Code S58.08.802.

On November 5, 1996, the people of the State of California adopted the Civil Rights Initiative ("Proposition 209") as an amendment to the California Constitution. The initiative provides, in pertinent part, that "the state shall not discriminate against, or grant preferential treatment to, any individual or group on the basis of race, color, ethnicity, or national origin in the operation of public employment, public education, or contracting." In the ballot proposal that accompanied Proposition 209 proponents declared that the initiative would save state and local governments money because "bidders on contracts no longer would need to show 'good faith efforts' to use minority or women owned subcontractors." Accordingly, state and local

governments save money "to the extent that they otherwise would have rejected a low bidder - because the bidder did not make a 'good faith effort' - and awarded the contract to a higher bidder."

Dear City Clerk:

By this letter, Luppen & Hawley, Inc. formally protests the award of City Contract No. PN: WH36 for the Sump 128 Generator and Transfer Switch Installation Project to BRC Construction, Inc.

On November 5, 1997, Luppen & Hawley, Inc. submitted a bid for the above-referenced contract to the City of Sacramento, Department of Utilities.
