Together with Report on Subject, which was ordered filed, City Manager presented the following Resolution recommending adoption:

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION NUMBER 2347

"RESOLVED, that it is the intention of the City Council of the City of Sacramento to order the following street work to be done, to-wit:

"That the alley between Serra Way and "T" Street, from a point 82.06 feet east of the easterly line of 34th Street, to the westerly line of the alley first east of 34th Street which runs north and south between Serra Way and "T" Street, in the City of Sacramento, be closed, vacated and abandoned.

"And said City Council does hereby determine and declare that said proposed work and improvement is of more than local or ordinary public benefit, and will affect and benefit the lands and district hereinafter described, and which said district is hereby declared to be the district affected and benefited by said work and improvement, and that, therefore, the entire damages, costs and expenses of said work and improvement shall be, and are hereby, made chargeable against, and shall be assessable upon, said lands and district, which district is within the City of Sacramento, County of Sacramento, State of California; and the exterior boundaries of the lands affected and benefited by said work and improvement are particularly described as follows, to-wit:

"Bounded on the north by the southerly line of Serra Way; on the south by the northerly line of "T" Street; on the east by the westerly line of the alley first east of 34th Street, which runs north and south between Serra Way and "T" Street; and on the west by a line parallel to the easterly line of 34th Street and 82.06 feet distant therefrom, measured at right angles.

"All of the herein proposed work shall be done in pursuance of an act of the legislature of the State of California entitled, "An act to provide for laying out, opening, extending, widening, straightening or closing up in whole or in part any street, square, lane, alley, court or place within municipalities, and to condemn and acquire any and all land and property necessary or convenient for that purpose," approved March 6, 1889, and the several acts amendatory thereof or supplemental thereto.

"The "Sacramento Union" is hereby designated as the daily newspaper published and circulated in said City in which the Superintendent of Street's notice of the passage of this resolution shall be published."

"BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Sacramento that certain improvements are proposed to be done and made within the boundaries of the proposed assessment district hereinafter described.

"In connection therewith, said City Council hereby finds and determines as follows, to-wit:

"1. That the nature of the proposed improvement consists of removing and disposing of all surplus and refuse material; constructing concrete curb and gutter; installing cast iron gutter drains; constructing concrete manhole complete with cast iron curb and cover; reconstructing existing manholes by placing curbs and covers to grade; grading; and constructing an asphaltic concrete pavement three (3) inches in thickness with seal coat and screenings, on a crusher-run gravel sub-base four (4) inches in thickness.

"2. The location and extent of the proposed improvements will involve the construction of the above described improvements upon the following described public street within the boundaries of the proposed assessment district hereinafter described, to-wit:

"Y" STREET, from the easterly line of Stockton Boulevard, to the easterly line of 45th Street, in the City of Sacramento.

"3. The boundaries of the district of lands proposed to be specially assessed to pay the costs and expenses of such proposed work and improvement are generally defined as follows, to-wit:

"On the west by the easterly line of Stockton Boulevard; on the east by the easterly boundary of Wright & Kimbrough Addition No. 12" (as the same is shown on the official Amended Plat thereof filed in the office of the County Recorder of the County of Sacramento, State of California); on the south by a line drawn from the southeast corner of Lot 299 in said addition, to the southwest corner of Lot 309 in said addition; thence to the southeast corner of Lot 310 in said addition; thence to the southwest corner of said Lot 310; and on the north by a line commencing at the northwest corner of Lot 283 in said addition; thence to the northeast corner of said Lot 283; thence along the westerly line of Lot 284 in said addition, to the alley first north of "Y" Street; thence easterly along the southerly line of said alley and said alley line produced, to the easterly line of 45th Street.

"4. The amount and portion of the cost of such proposed improvement proposed to be paid by the City of Sacramento from any source other than special assessments upon benefited property is nil.

5. The statute under which it is proposed to conduct proceedings for the proposed improvement is the "Improvement Act of 1911," approved April 7, 1911, and the several acts amendatory thereof or supplemental thereto; with bonds to be issued as authorized under the "Improvement Bond Act of 1915," approved June 11, 1915, and the several acts amendatory thereof or supplemental thereto, said bonds to bear interest at the rate of five (5%) per cent per annum; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Engineer is hereby directed to prepare for this Council a written Report upon the proposed improvement, such Report to contain all the information required by Section 3 of the "Special Assessment Investigation, Limitation and Majority Protest Act of 1931," approved June 8, 1931, and the several acts amendatory thereof or supplemental thereto."
