

# RESOLUTION NO. 2003-698

ADOPTED BY THE SACRAMENTO CITY COUNCIL

ON THE DATE OF OCT 9 2003

## A RESOLUTION AWARDING ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT TREATMENT CAPACITY BANK CONNECTION FEE CREDITS BY SACRAMENTO REGIONAL COUNTY SANITATION DISTRICT (SRCSD) FOR Q – CUP RESTAURANT.

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO THAT:**

WHEREAS, on March 20, 2001, City Council authorized the City Manager to sign a Memorandum Of Understanding (MOU) to initiate City participation in the Sacramento Regional County Sanitation District Economic Development Treatment Capacity Bank (CC2001-177);

WHEREAS, eighty five percent (85%), or 6,775 of the total 7,971 ESD's (Equivalent Single-family Dwelling units) made available to the City of Sacramento under the MOU are allocated for economic development projects, the award of which must be approved by City Council resolution;

WHEREAS, Q – Cup Restaurant located at 5635 Freeport Blvd, Suite 4 in Sacramento meets City economic development objectives by being in the Freeport Blvd neighborhood commercial corridor, as identified in the adopted City Economic Development Strategy, a catalyst use (restaurant), and creating new employment.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Sacramento, as follows:

1. City Council hereby awards a maximum of 2.16 ESD credits from the Sacramento Regional County Sanitation District Economic Development Treatment Capacity Bank to Q – Cup Restaurant located at 5635 Freeport Blvd, Suite 4 in Sacramento (APN: 025-0121-021).
2. Any and all credits awarded herein to each individual recipient shall expire if said individual recipient has not paid its requisite sewer impact fee to SRCSD within one-year from the date of approval of this resolution.





4. Award herein of 2.16 sewer credits will leave a total of 6,311 sewer credits for future award by the City to support economic development projects.
