Weston presented the information on Wilkerson Fellowship for the Technical Arts which will recognize and honor outstanding contributions of professional artists working behind the scenes in the technical fields related to the visual, performing, media and literary arts. Research was conducted throughout the nation to seek other fellowship programs. The findings indicated that no other Technical Arts programs exist, therefore, making the Commission the first to implement such a program. Staff formed a local advisory committee with various areas of technical expertise, to make recommendations and provide input on finalize the Guidelines and Nomination/Application.

The awards categories for the Technical Fellowship Programs are: Arts Education, Community Arts, Emerging Artist, Achievement Award, Commissioners' Award and Mayor & county Supervisors' Award. Disciplines include but are not limited to designers, bookmakers, film editors, conservators, animators, scenic painters, illustrators, instrument makers, computer graphics, and sound engineers, etc. However, the creator of the primary work is not eligible because they were included in prior year Fellowships. Fellowships are awarded in a competitive process. Applicants must submit support material evident of artistic expression, professional activity and achievements, resume, and letters of recommendations. Approximately \$35,000 has been set aside for the fellowships.

Heller discussed policy with the Commission regarding eligibility issues specifically, who is eligible to apply?

Woodlock questioned whether the program should support commercial productions in addition to non-profit organizations. Friedman stated that the criteria should be based on creativity and innovation of the artist's work rather than focusing on the non-profit verse for profit. Walker stated the panel will review the art background, experience and body of work of the artist. Commission agreed to leave it to the panel to decide.
