Title: Contract: Hydraulic Equipment Parts and Repair Services

Recommendation: Adopt a **Resolution:** 1) awarding Berendsen Fluid Power, the lowest responsive and responsible bidder, a one-year contract with three one-year renewal options for the purchase of hydraulic parts and repair services in an amount not to exceed \$1,081,842; and 2) authorizing the City Manager or the City Manager's designee to execute the contract specified above provided that sufficient funds are available in the budget adopted for the applicable fiscal year(s).

Description/Analysis:

Issue: The Department of General Services, Fleet Management Division, has an ongoing need for hydraulic parts and repair services for the maintenance and repair of City owned vehicles and equipment.

Policy Considerations: The recommendations in this report are in accordance with the provisions of City Code Section 3.56.

Committee/Commission Action: Not applicable

Environmental Considerations: The current proposal involves the purchasing of parts and repair services for the repair and maintenance of City vehicles and

equipment. The proposal is not a 'project' in accordance with Section 15378 of the California Environmental Quality Act Guidelines. The proposal does not have a potential for resulting in either direct or indirect physical changes in the environment. Therefore, as determined by the City's Environmental Services Planning Manager, no environmental review is necessary.

Rationale for Recommendation: In support of City departments, the Department of General Services, Fleet Management Division has an ongoing need for hydraulic parts and repair services for the maintenance and repair of City owned vehicles and equipment.


In March 2008, Procurement Services, in accordance with City Code Section 3.56, issued Invitation for Bid No. B081181057 for the purchase of hydraulic equipment parts and repair services. Two responses were received. One of the respondents, Municipal Maintenance Equipment, was unable to meet the bid requirements. Therefore, the lowest responsive and responsible bidder was determined to be Berendsen Fluid Power. A summary of the bid results is provided in Attachment 1.


Financial Considerations: This report recommends awarding and executing a one-year contract with three one-year renewal options with Berendsen Fluid Power for the purchase of hydraulic equipment parts and repair services. The estimated annual amounts are as follows:

Berendsen Fluid Power	\$251,000	\$263,550	\$276,728	\$290,564	\$1,081,842

The potential four year term of this contract will begin in FY2007/08 and conclude in FY2011/12. Pricing for years 2 – 4 will be at the original bid price plus a potential annual price increase not to exceed 5%. Sufficient funds are available in the Department of General Services, Fleet Management, FY2007/08 operating budget to purchase the required parts and repair services through June 30, 2008. Purchases after June 30, 2008 are subject to funding availability in the adopted budget of the applicable fiscal year.

Emerging Small Business Development (ESBD): Berendsen Fluid Power is not certified as an emerging/small business firm. For the most recent complete fiscal year (FY2006/07), the Department of General Services achieved an ESBD percentage of 62%.



AWARD CONTRACT FOR THE PURCHASE OF HYDRAULIC PARTS AND REPAIR SERVICES

BACKGROUND

- A. The Department of General Services, Fleet Management Division, has an ongoing need for hydraulic parts and repair services for the maintenance and repair of City owned vehicles and equipment.
- B. In March 2008, Procurement Services, in accordance with City Code Section 3.56, issued Invitation for Bid No. B081181057 for the purchase of hydraulic equipment parts and repair services. The lowest responsive and responsible bidder was determined to be Berendsen Fluid Power.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. Berendsen Fluid Power, the lowest responsive and responsible bidder, is awarded a one-year contract with three one-year renewal options for the purchase of hydraulic parts and repair services in an amount not to exceed \$1,081,842.
- Section 2. The City Manager or the City Manager's designee is authorized to execute the contract specified above provided that sufficient funds are available in the budget adopted for the applicable fiscal year(s).
