

Sacramento, California,

December 8, 1930.

The Civil Service Board of the City of Sacramento met in special session on the above date at 7:10 o'clock P. M. in the office of the Board, Room 106 City Hall, President Chenu presiding.

PRESENT: Commissioners Maloney, Weisman and Chenu.  
ABSENT : None.

The reading of the minutes of the previous meetings was dispensed with.

Sergeant Richards of the Sacramento Police Department appeared before the Board, representing the Widows and Orphans Aid Association, and requested of the Board information as to when George H. Lofquist's probation period commenced. Mr. Lofquist started work April 16, 1930, under a temporary appointment, serving continuously since the date mentioned. After considering the matter of probation, Commissioner Maloney moved that Mr. Lofquist's probation start as of the date of his entrance into the city service; namely, April 16, 1930. This motion was seconded by Commissioner Weisman and the vote was as follows:

AYES: Commissioners Maloney, Weisman and Chenu.  
NOES: None.

Mr. Arthur Leiva appeared before the Board requesting information as to what action, if any, had come before this Board relative to the classification of Inspectors in the Fire Department. The Chairman, on behalf of the Board, advised Mr. Leiva that no action concerning the classification of Inspectors in the Fire Department had thus far been presented to the Board. Mr. Leiva also questioned the Board as to the present standing of Mr. Angelo, now employed at the Incinerator.

The reading of the minutes of the meetings of October 14, October 27, October 28, October 29, October 30, October 31, November 13, and

November 24 were read and approved as read.

A communication was received from Judge Shelley relative to the replacement of Mrs. Rose Frichette, and requesting information from the Board when such action should take place. Commissioner Weisman moved that due to the circumstances now surrounding the case of Mrs. Frichette, that she be allowed to remain in her present position until January 1, 1931. There was no second to this motion.

Commissioner Maloney moved that action in the matter of replacement of Mrs. Frichette take place with the least practicable delay, and that a letter be directed to Judge Shelley containing this information.

Commissioner Chenu relinquished the Chair to Commissioner Weisman. Commissioner Chenu seconded the motion, and the vote was as follows:

AYES: Commissioners Maloney and Chenu.

NOES: Commissioner Weisman.

Commissioner Weisman relinquished the Chair to Commissioner Chenu. A communication was received from Mr. James S. Dean, City


Manager, with reference to the request of C. F. Schneider for reinstatement in the city service. A report was submitted by Mr. Dean and Ralph A. Stevenson, Superintendent of the Filtration Plant, wherein all the circumstances of the case were explained. Mr. Stevenson stated in his letter that he could not recommend Mr. Schneider for reinstatement. This report was concurred in by Mr. F. J. Klaus, City Engineer, and City Manager James S. Dean.

Commissioner Weisman moved that the Secretary be instructed to present at each meeting a list of all new employees and that this be placed at the bottom of the present calendar presented at each meeting. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Maloney and the vote was as follows:

AYES: Commissioners Maloney, Weisman and Chenu.

NOES: None.
