City Manager presented report relative to burial of indigents at City Cemetery and also submitted the following resolution recommending its adoption:

RESOLUTION NO. 258, CITY COUNCIL.

"BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO, AS FOLLOWS: "That Sections "O" and "W" of the City Cemetery are hereby set apart for the burial of indigent dead, and that there be no further sale of lots in said sections, except for the purpose of burial of indigents. "AND, WHEREAS, it appears that the sections set aside by this resolution for the burial of indigents will be filled up and fully occupied by graves within the space of not exceeding seventeen (17) months, and that it is essential for grounds to be procured by outside of the City Cemetery for the burial of indigent dead, "IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Manager be, and he is hereby, instructed to communicate with the Board of Supervisors of the County of Sacramento and request said Board of Supervisors to take steps to procure a burial ground for the burial of indigents by the county outside of the said City Cemetery.

Councilman Brown moved that foregoing Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Councilman Bidwell and carried by following vote:

After general discussion by members of Council, Councilman Frazier moved that application be referred back to City Manager for re-consideration and hearing postponed oneweek. Seconded by Councilman Goddard and carried by following vote:

"RESOLVED: That the Superintendent of Streets of the City of Sacramento, be and is hereby directed to grant the following extension of time on contract for the performance of street work, provided that in no event shall any liability accrue by reason thereof to the City of Sacramento, or to the said Superintendent of Streets, to-wit:

"To A. Teichert & Son or assigns thirty days on their contract to improve 40th Street, from E Street north; and D and E Streets from San Antonio Way to 40th Street; and rights-of-way, pursuant to Resolution of Intention No. 1897.

Councilman Anderson moved that foregoing Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Councilman Kiernan and carried by following vote:
