

RESOLUTION No. 933

Adopted by The Sacramento City Council on date of

WHEREAS, on August 15 1941, United States Pipe and Foundry Co. made a bid on furnishing Bell and Spigot Water Pipe and, in the bid stated that the prices bid were based on its being able to make shipment by steamer from Mobile, Alabama, to Oakland, California, through the Panama Canal, and date of delivery was based upon being able to secure steamer space, and

WHEREAS, by letter dated December 22 1941, said company advised that at the present time it did not know whether or not there will be available any Intercoastal steamship on which the pipe could be shipped; that there is one vessel tentatively scheduled to sail on January 24 1942, but it is very doubtful that it will sail because of activities of Japanese submarines along the Pacific Coast, and

WHEREAS, the City is informed by the company that it is impossible to schedule the manufacture of the pipe unless it is certain of being able to make shipment and suggest that it can make shipment by all rail freight at an extra cost, instead of in the manner specified in the bid,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

That the City Manager be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed to notify said company to manufacture the pipe and ship it by all rail freight; that the extra cost, amounting - according to present rates - to approximately \$1,520.00, be, and it is hereby appropriated for this purpose, and the City Controller is hereby so notified.
