Subject: Extension of the Temporary Closure of Selma Street, Temporary Closure Proceeding No. TSC05-02

Location/Council District: Selma Street bounded by El Camino Avenue, Clay Avenue, Lexington Street and Dixieanne Avenue within Council District 2 (see Attachment A)

Recommendation:

Adopt the resolution approving the Extension of the Temporary Closure of Selma Street bounded by El Camino Avenue, Clay Avenue, Lexington Street and Dixieanne Avenue.

Summary:

On March 4, 2004, the City Council approved the temporary closure of the subject street for 18 months. Neighboring residents in Council District 2 request that the City extend the temporary closure of the subject street for an additional period of 18 months. Staff recommends this street closure extension pursuant to Vehicle Code 21101.4 and Sacramento City Code 12.16.

Committee/Commission Action: None.

Background Information:

With the majority support of the residents and property owners abutting the subject street, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 2004-151 on March 4, 2004 to temporarily close Selma Street. This street closure was in effect for 18 months or until September 4, 2005. The temporary closure has expired and residents and property owners abutting the subject street have requested the City extend the closure of the

subject street for an additional period of 18 months. This street closure extension will continue the prevention, or at least the reduction, of the occurrences of crime-related activities in the subject street. Staff has determined that the request to extend the closure of the subject street meets the criteria set forth in the Vehicle Code 21101.4 and Sacramento City Code 12.16.

The Police Department recommends the implementation of the extension of the temporary closure of the subject street. This closure will assist in preventing the occurrence or reoccurrence of crime related activities in the subject street (see Attachment B).

Verification has been obtained from the Fire Department that the proposed closure extension will not adversely impact their operation or safety in the surrounding neighborhoods (see Attachment C).

Verification has been obtained from the Department of Transportation that the extension of the proposed street closure does not include a through highway or an arterial street. The street closure allows adequate and safe traffic circulation on the adjacent streets (see Attachment D).

The subject street closure is not to exceed eighteen (18) months unless the closure is properly extended. Once approved, the closure may be extended for an additional five (5) consecutive periods of not more than eighteen (18) months each. Prior to each extension, City Council must hold a public hearing.

Noticing to the public regarding the street closure extension has been completed prior to City Council meeting in accordance with City Code section 12.16.220.

Financial Considerations:

The applicant is responsible for all fees required to process the request for the street closure extension and there is no cost to the City.

Environmental Considerations:

The Environmental Planning Services Division of the Development Services Department has reviewed the street closure extension and determined that the activity is exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) under Section 15301(f) of the CEQA Guidelines. This project consists of the temporary closure of an existing road by adding gates to the entrances of the alley. This temporary closure involves no expansion of use beyond what currently exists. Access to the road will be given to appropriate departments and agencies.

Policy Considerations:

The street closure extension is in furtherance of Vehicle Code Section 21101.4 and Sacramento City Code Chapter 12.16 allowing the extension of temporary closure

through street or alley. This is consistent with the City's Strategic plan in that it will enhance and preserve the neighborhoods.

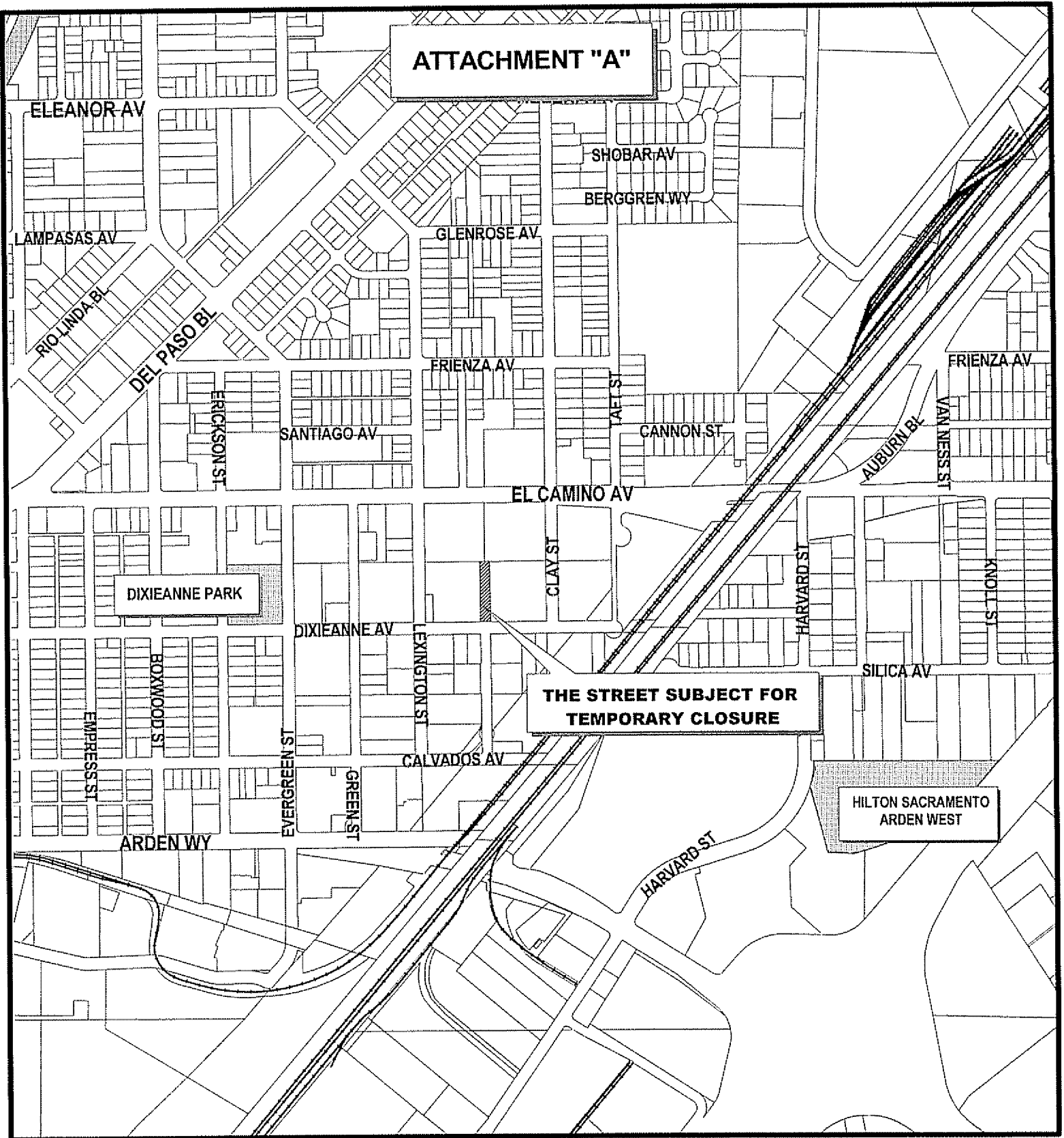

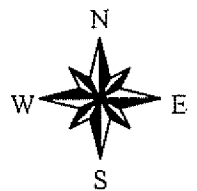
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TEMPORARY STREET CLOSURE, TSC05-02



RESOLUTION APPROVING THE EXTENSION OF THE TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF SELMA COURT BOUNDED BY EL CAMINO AVENUE, CLAY AVENUE, LEXINGTON AND DIXIEANNE AVENUE WITHIN COUNCIL DISTRICT 2

TEMPORARY CLOSURE PROCEEDING NO. TSC05-02

BACKGROUND

- A. The City received a request from the abutting property owners and residents to the subject street to extend the temporary closure of the subject street to stop the occurrences of crime related activities.
- B. The Vehicle Code of the State of California Section 21101.4 and the Sacramento City Code Chapter 12.16 authorizes the City Council to extend the temporary closure of streets and alleys to prevent occurrences of crime related activities.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. Based upon substantial evidence present in the record of the proceedings regarding this matter, City Council hereby makes the following findings:
 - a. There are serious and continual criminal activity in the area of the road recommended for street closure extension. This finding is based upon a recommendation of the police department.
 - b. The road recommended for street closure extension is under the City's jurisdiction and has not been designated as a through highway or arterial street.
 - c. Vehicle or pedestrian traffic in the street recommended street closure extension contributes to the criminal activity that is occurring there.
 - d. The street closure extension will not substantially adversely affect traffic flow, safety on the streets or in the surrounding neighborhoods, the operation of emergency vehicles, the performance of municipal or public utility services, or the delivery of freight by commercial vehicles in the area of the street closure.
- Section 2. The Council finds and determines that the street closure extension of the subject street will substantially alleviate the existing serious and continual criminal activity in that street.

Section 3. City Council grants this street closure extension of the road with the following conditions:

- a. A gate security device approved by the Sacramento Fire Department will be installed on the gates.
- b. City departments and utility companies will have twenty-four (24) hour access to their facilities within the road.
