

REGULAR MEETING
SACRAMENTO CITY COUNCIL
November 26, 1963

The Honorable City Council met in regular session on this date at the hour of 7:45 o'clock P. M., Mayor McKinney presiding and roll call was answered as follows:

PRESENT: Councilmen Christensen, Domich, McKinney, Mering, Murphy, Nielsen, Rouse and Talkin.

ABSENT: Councilman Marriott.

The City Clerk reported having furnished each member with a copy of proceedings of previous meeting. The minutes of the Regular Meeting of November 21, 1963 were ordered approved.

Communication from Guy A. West, President of the Sacramento State College, requesting a study of the traffic problem at the J Street entrance to Sacramento State College, was received and read at this time.

Mr. Al Dreyfuss, Architect preparing the master plan for the Sacramento State College, appeared and addressed the Council regarding plans for expansion of the State College and verbally requested the City consider a grade separation at the J Street entrance to the College property.

Following continued discussion of the matter, the City Manager was instructed to have a study made relating to the traffic problem at the J Street entrance to the State College.

This having been the date set for hearing on appeal from Planning Commission action disapproving plans for building at Freeport Boulevard and Weller Way, for the "Barrel O'Goodies, Inc.," Zoning Administrator, Fred Freitas, appeared and reviewed action of the Architectural Advisory Committee and the City Planning Commission in disapproving the building plans for said property.

A communication from James W. Case, President of the Barrel O'Goodies, Inc., advising that he was unable to appear at this instant meeting was read and ordered placed on file, whereupon Council agreed to continue the matter to the Regular Meeting of December 12, 1963.

Councilman Marriott arrived at this time.

In accordance with report of the City Engineer and recommendation of the City Manager, filed on this date, Councilman Domich moved that the following resolution be adopted:

4514 Resolution approving assessment No. 3642, in the matter of the construction of a Water Distribution System, complete with all necessary appurtenances, in Belleview Avenue from the center line of Fruitridge Road to the center line of Lemon Hill Avenue, and Lemon Hill Avenue lying between a point located 100 feet East of the Northerly production of the Westerly line of Lot 10 of Lemon Hill Annex and the Easterly boundary of said Lemon Hill Annex. (Reference is hereby made to original resolution adopted on this date and set out in full in Resolution Record 1963, on file in the office of the City Clerk).

Seconded by Councilman Nielsen and carried by the following vote:

Having been continued from the Regular Meeting of November 21, 1963, the City Manager's recommendation that the application for Billiard License at 3316 Sacramento Boulevard be denied was again considered at this time.

4515 Mr. Clarence B. Canson, Attorney, representing Samuel C. Daniels, the applicant, appeared and urged the Council to grant the said license.

Following discussion of the matter, Councilman Talkin moved that the recommendation of the City Manager be accepted and that the application be denied.

4516 With letter of transmittal, which was ordered filed, the City Manager presented and Councilman Murphy moved that specifications for furnishing one 1½-ton Stake Body Truck with a hoist for use on the golf courses at an estimated cost of \$3,150.00 be adopted and the City Clerk instructed to advertise for bids thereon to be received up to the hour of 5:00 o'clock P.M., on date of December 12, 1963.

Seconded by Councilman Domich and carried by the following vote:

AYES: Councilmen Christensen, Domich, Marriott, McKinney, Mering, Murphy, Nielsen, Rouse and Talkin.

4517 With letter of transmittal, which was ordered filed, the City Manager presented and Councilman Rouse moved that specifications for furnishing a truck chassis with service body and wrecker installed at an estimated cost of \$8,400.00 be adopted and the City Clerk instructed to advertise for bids thereon to be received up to the hour of 5:00 o'clock P.M., on date of December 19, 1963.

4518 With letter of transmittal, which was ordered filed, the City Manager presented and Councilman Nielsen moved that specifications for furnishing the City's annual supply of incandescent and fluorescent lamps for the period of January 1, 1964, to December 31, 1964, inclusive, at an estimated cost of \$7,500.00 be adopted and the City Clerk instructed to advertise for bids thereon to be received up to the hour of 5:00 o'clock P.M., on date of December 12, 1963.

Seconded by Councilman Rouse and carried by the following vote:

4519 With letter of transmittal, which was ordered filed, the City Manager presented and Councilman Nielsen moved that specifications for furnishing the City's annual supply of traffic line paint for use of the Traffic Engineering Division at an estimated cost of \$19,000.00 be adopted and the City Clerk instructed to advertise for bids thereon to be received up to the hour of 5:00 o'clock P.M., on date of December 12, 1963.

4520 In accordance with bids received on date of November 21, 1963, and recommendation of the City Manager, filed on this date, Councilman Mering moved that the bid of Hawkins-Hawkins Co., Inc., in the amount of \$2,450.56 be accepted for furnishing 2,188 street name signs for the Traffic Engineering Division and that the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized to execute Contract No. 595, when same has been prepared and approved by the City Attorney.

In accordance with bids received on date of November 21, 1963, and recommendation of the City Manager filed on this date, Councilman Marriott moved that the bid of Armando Magri, in the amount of \$8,757.03 be accepted for furnishing five (5) three-wheel motorcycles for use of the Police Traffic Division and that the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized to execute Contract No. 596, when same has been prepared and approved by the City Attorney. 4521

The City Manager presented the Controller's Report of Fund Cash Balances as of October 31, 1963, together with Treasurer's Report of the same date, and same were ordered placed on file. 4523

In accordance with report of the Assistant City Engineer and recommendation of the City Manager, Councilman Domich moved that the work of Franklin T. Gassaway & Sons, contractors for the Widening of San Francisco Boulevard from 50th Street to 55th Street, be accepted as completed as of November 15, 1963, and final payment therefore made to said contractor. 4524

Seconded by Councilman Nielsen and carried by the following vote:

In accordance with report of the Assistant City Engineer and recommendation of the City Manager, filed on this date, Councilman Mering moved that the work of Garrett & Gaitero, contractors for the construction of the Del Paso-Robla Firehouse Addition, be accepted as completed as of November 21, 1963, and final payment therefore made to said contractor. 4525

In accordance with report and recommendation of the City Manager, which was ordered filed, Councilman Marriott moved that Mr. Harvey O. Johnson be granted permission to hunt pheasants during the 1963 hunting season on property owned by him located at Section 10 of Rancho Del Paso in Sacramento. 4526

Seconded by Councilman Mering and carried by the following vote:

Councilman Talkin advised the Council that the report on hypnosis would be deferred until after the first of the year.

Councilman Marriott addressed the Council and presented the following resolution memorializing the late President, John F. Kennedy, and moved its adoption:

RESOLUTION NO. 753

WHEREAS, on the 22nd day of November 1963, an assassin's bullet took from us our 35th President, John Fitzgerald Kennedy, and

WHEREAS, John Fitzgerald Kennedy left us a legacy of greatness in word and deed, and

WHEREAS, not only the citizens of this nation, but people the world over, were shocked and outraged at his manner and time of passing, and

WHEREAS, throughout the subsequent events of the past three days, Jacqueline Kennedy has carved her own indelible profile in courage on the hearts of all Americans;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Sacramento City Council does express, on behalf of the citizens of Sacramento, heartfelt condolences to Jacqueline, Caroline and John Kennedy, and to members of the former President's family,

4527 AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Council, having heard the words of President Lyndon Baines Johnson upon assuming his new office, to wit: "I ask your help, and God's", does pledge its support and its prayers as he shoulders the responsibilities, and faces the challenges, which can come only to the man who is President of these United States.

Seconded by Councilman Christensen and carried by the following vote:

AYES: Councilmen Christensen, Domich, Marriott, McKinney, Mering, Murphy, Nielsen, Rouse and Talkin.

The Recreation and Parks Committee of the Council was authorized to study the feasibility of naming a City facility after the late President, John F. Kennedy.

Vice-Mayor Nielsen introduced the late President's Thanksgiving Proclamation into the record.

Councilman Domich moved that Mayor McKinney be granted permission to leave the State to attend the American Municipal Association Board of Directors Meeting in Phoenix, Arizona.
