It is recommended that the City Council, by resolution, approve participation in the 2000/2001 Workforce Investment Act - Youth Program and authorize the City Manager to execute all agreements and documents relative to the program. Further it recommends amending the FY 1999-2000 Budget by \$183,038 and the addition of 10 FTE for Youth Aides to reflect the operation of the 2000/2001 Workforce Investment Act - Youth Program.

SUMMARY:

This report provides information about the new Workforce Investment Act that has replaced the Job Training Partnership Act and recommends that the City Council amend the current year budget and authorize the City Manager to execute various agreements relative to the current funding cycle from May 1, 2000 through June 30, 2001.

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BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The United States Department of Labor has replaced the Job Training Partnership Act (J.T.P.A.) with the Workforce Investment Act (W.I.A.) effective in 2000. The City of Sacramento has operated the Summer Youth Employment and Training Program (S.Y.E.T.P.) under JTPA, funded locally through the Sacramento Employment and Training Agency (S.E.T.A.) since 1989. The Workforce Investment Act - Youth Program takes the place of the S.Y.E.T.P.

The S.Y.E.T.P. was a program that only operated during the summer, providing work experience and academic enrichment to Sacramento youth for eight weeks. The City of Sacramento was one of fourteen program operators that recruited youth, developed job sites, provided workers compensation to the youth, and provided support services to the youth and the job site supervisors throughout the eight week program.

The W.I.A.- Youth Program is a year round program that requires agencies to provide work experience linked to academic learning, secondary school completion services, leadership development opportunities, adult mentors, comprehensive guidance and counseling, supportive services, and follow-up services for a minimum of twelve months after the youth leaves the program. The Department of Labor is investing more money in fewer youth in order to provide the services required for the youth to successfully transition into non-subsidized work and to complete high school.

The City of Sacramento has been funded to serve fifty-six in-school youth. The City identified three target groups. These target groups are youth enrolled in special education with Sacramento City Unified School District; youth enrolled through Opportunity Knocks at Burbank High School, an intervention program for youth who are not attending school and are from CalWORKS families, funded through the Department of Human of Assistance; and youth enrolled through programs for teens at city operated community centers.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

The City of Sacramento was one of fourteen agencies to submit a proposal for funding to provide services to in-school youth. The City was funded for \$183,038 to serve 56 youth during this first year of funding. Need to establish 10.0 FTE Youth Aide positions.

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:




