The Honorable City Council met in Regular Session on this date at 8.30 P. M., P. M., Mayor Elkus presiding and Roll Call being answered by following members of City Council:-

The Minutes of Regular Meeting of November 6th, 1924 were read and approved.

Donald H. Green, Attorney, addressed Council presenting petition of property owners on 51st Street north of J Street for two arc lights, which was referred to City Manager.

Councilman Bidwell then addressed Council to the effect that before acceptance of report, the City Manager should also make definite report as to responsibility for settlement of filter beds and error in detailing party wall, in response to which, City Manager requested privilege of making further recommendations in matter, and Councilman Kiernan as a substitute moved that report be filed and the City Manager requested to submit further report at next meeting of the Council. 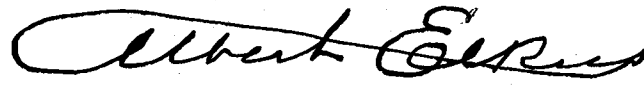
