

MINUTES OF CIVIL SERVICE BOARD
CITY OF SACRAMENTO
SPECIAL MEETING

January 28, 1936

The Civil Service Board met in special session in the office of the Board at 8:15 P.M.

PRESENT: Commissioner Stacy and President Chenu.
ABSENT : Commissioner Deise.

SERGEANTS OF POLICE
SENIORITY

Sergeants F. W. Cameron, C. E. Nunn,
C. N. LaDue, L. E. Warren, P. C.
Gamble, A. J. Taylor, Verne Lewis,

and Lee Parker appeared together with Attorney Clifford Russell, representing Sergeants J. V. McKinney and E. L. Roberts. Their purpose in appearing was to discuss the question of seniority within their ranks. Sergeant Parker stated that his date of appointment as a Corporal was prior to the date others had been appointed as Sergeants and that City Council Resolution 147, dated June 8, 1933, affected Sergeants Warren, McAllister, Peart, and Parker and that they felt the resolution with the attendant Ordinance 580-4 S caused no change in their status in that they felt their dates of seniority as Sergeants should date from their time of appointment as Corporals. All entered into the discussion with Sergeants Cameron, Gamble and Lewis expressing an opinion that those who were Sergeants prior to the passage of Ordinance 580-4 S should not lose Seniority to those who were Corporals prior to that time. After discussion the Board instructed the Secretary to secure an opinion from the City Attorney relative thereto.

HERRERA, JOSEPH
EMPLOYMENT

Mr. Herrera stated that he had not quite completed six months service

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with the city as a Laborer during 1935, but that in 1931 had been employed and desired to know if he could not be placed upon a lay-off list rather than continuing upon a Laborer's eligible register. After discussion the Secretary was instructed to request an opinion from the City Attorney as to whether or not employees' time could be cumulative or must it be uninterrupted in order to count toward a lay-off.

SALARIES

The Secretary read a letter addressed to Mr. Chenu, requesting that his office be notified of a time that the Board would meet with his representatives to discuss salaries being paid city employees. The Secretary was instructed to notify him of the Board's next meeting.
