

Sacramento, California,
February 25, 1931.

The Civil Service Board of the City of Sacramento met in special session on the above date at 5:00 o'clock P. M. in the office of the Board, Room 106 City Hall, President Chenu presiding.

PRESENT: Commissioners Maloney, Weisman, and Chenu.
ABSENT : None.

The minutes of the meeting of February 16, 1931, were read and approved as corrected.

A communication was received from the City Attorney with reference to the discharge from military service of Lowell Moffitt. Mr. Moffitt received a discharge marked "Honorable" but due to the circumstances surrounding the discharge from service, an opinion was requested from the City Attorney. The City Attorney found in his opinion that where an honorable discharge is given and is so shown on the face of the discharge, that the claimant is entitled to the preference as provided for in Section 45 of the City Charter. The communication was ordered filed.

A communication was received from Lolita Kelley with reference to Mr. Kelley her husband, who was a candidate in the recent examination held for Uniform Fireman. The communication was ordered filed.

The attention of the Board was directed to certain apparent irregularities now existing in the employment of R. W. Penney, Albert Hicks, Veander Tillman, and Roy V. Wise. Upon motion by

Commissioner Weisman, seconded by Commissioner Maloney, and unanimously carried, these matters were laid over.

A discussion of the classification of Mechanic followed. Upon motion by Commissioner Weisman, seconded by Commissioner Maloney, and unanimously carried, this matter was laid over in order to permit the Board to interview the City Manager regarding this classification.

Commissioner Maloney moved that Rule 4 be amended and added thereto the following, to be known and numbered Section 3, and spread upon the minutes to be called by the Board at a meeting in conformity with Rule 10, Section 4:

"When an eligible list is already in existence and new examinations are held to provide additional eligibles, unless such original list has been abolished by order of the Board, all successful candidates shall have their names placed upon the original eligible list in accordance with the rating received in the respective examinations."

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Weisman. The vote was as follows:

AYES: Commissioners Maloney, Weisman, and Chenu.
NOES: None.

Commissioner Maloney moved that Rule 4 be amended and added thereto the following, to be known and numbered Section 4, and spread upon the minutes to be called by the Board at a meeting in conformity with Rule 10, Section 4:

"Term of Eligibility. All eligible lists shall continue in force for a period of at least one year after being promulgated by the Board. Any eligible list may be

abolished at any time after the period of one year by order of the Board, good reason appearing therefor. Notice of intention to abolish an eligible list shall be sent to all eligibles whose names appear upon the list to be abolished."

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Weisman. The vote was as follows:

AYES: Commissioners Maloney, Weisman, and Chenu.
NOES: None.

Upon motion by Commissioner Maloney, seconded by Commissioner Weisman and unanimously carried, the following eligible list for Uniform Fireman was established, to be posted March 2, 1931, and effective April 2, 1931:
