SUBJECT: Downtown Cultural and Entertainment District Master Plan

SUMMARY

The staff recommends that the Agency contribute \$25,000 for the preparation of a Downtown Cultural and Entertainment District Master Plan and enter into an Individual Project Agreement with the City of Sacramento for administration of the contract.

BACKGROUND

On April 4, 1989, the City Council authorized the distribution of a Request for Proposals for the preparation of a Downtown Cultural and Entertainment District Master Plan. The goal of the Plan is to create a concentrated mix of cultural and entertainment facilities to support weekend and evening arts and entertainment activities.

scope of work identified in the contract includes The entertainment goals and identification \mathbf{of} cultural and objectives, identification of facilities requirements, development of streetscape design features, and building to develop popular support for proposed programs and facilities. An implementation strategy will be developed which recommends financing mechanisms and prioritization of capital improvements. A detailed scope of contract services is attached as Exhibit "A." A tentative time schedule is attached as Exhibit

Williams-Kuebelbeck and Associates, in partnership with Kaplan McLaughlin and Diaz, architects, and Helen Fried Associates, arts consultants, have been selected to prepare the Plan. The contract amount is approximately \$60,000.

The City staff has requested that the Agency allocate \$25,000 from its budget of \$250,000 for Plaza Park improvements to the contract. In 1987, the Agency and the City entered into individual project agreement (IPA) which identified improvements to take place in the park with the Agency funds. Since that time, the City has reassessed the proposed improvements and chosen not to proceed with implementation until comprehensive identified and more funds program is available. The IPA has expired, and City and Agency staff believe that allocation of Plaza Park funds to the contract is appropriate since the park is included within the proposed District, and since the Plan will consider park activities such as the 1987 "City Life" program.

FINANCIAL DATA

Staff recommends that \$25,000 be allocated from the Plaza Park budget (Cost Center B00891) for an individual project agreement with the City of Sacramento, which specifies that the City will contract with Williams-Kuebelbeck & Associates for preparation of the Master Plan. The balance of the contract, \$35,000, will be funded by the City Community/Convention Center.

POLICY IMPLICATIONS

The recommended actions are consistent with the Merged Downtown Redevelopment Plan and Implementation Strategy which calls for the concentration of cultural and entertainment facilities in order to create an active area of nighttime and weekend activity.

MBE/WBE CONSIDERATIONS

Potential MBE/WBE vendors were identified from both the City and SHRA rosters of certified MBE/WBE firms. Requests for proposals were sent to eighteen of these firms. None of these firms submitted a proposal for consideration. The selected consultant is not an MBE/WBE vendor.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

CEQA: This proposed action is exempt per Section 15262; the action involves only funding of planning studies for possible future actions which the Agency has not approved, adopted or funded.

NEPA: Not applicable - no federal funds involved.

EXHIBIT "A"

SCOPE OF SERVICES

1. Summary.

The Project will unfold in two phases. Phase one will consist of a consensus building process aimed at developing a popularly supported plan of programs and facilities for the Project Area. This process will focus on assessing the cultural and entertainment needs of the Project Area and will culiminate in the drafting and adoption of a concept plan document ("Concept Plan") which will outline:

- (a) Cultural and entertainment goals and objectives for the Project Area;
- (b) Prioritized cultural and entertainment needs, including public and commercial uses;
- (c) The relationship between new and existing facilities and programs;
- (d) Short and long term financial support and funding options;
- (e) Market opportunities and potential development incentives for supporting private uses;
- (f) Ground floor land use, streetscape design features, and physical linkages; and
- (g) An overall vision for the Project Area as a viable and lively residential and commercial district.

Phase two will consist of a process aimed at developing a strategy for implementing the ideas contained in the Concept Plan. This process will focus on:

- (a) Developing financial models and resources, both public and private;
- (b) Establishing programatic links between cultural, ARE, and retail uses;
- (c) Identifying feasible new programs and facilities;
- (d) Prioritizing and phasing public capital improvements;
- (e) Establishing design criteria for new development; and
- (f) Developing the leadership necessary to achieve successful implementation.

The final product of the Project will be the Cultural and Entertainment Master Plan ("Master Plan") which will synthesize the programatic recommendations set forth in the Concept Plan and the implementation strategy developed in phase two.
