WORK PERMITS

The members of the Board discussed the present policy of granting work permits to employees to accept part-time employment in addition to their regular city employment, stating that a complaint had again been received from the City Manager with reference to abuses of work permits granted to employees in the Park Department.

Mr. Finks addressed the Board stating that work hours have been reduced and vacation time increased for the purpose of allowing employees more leisure time and not for the purpose of working elsewhere, and that he was in favor of eliminating work permits entirely.

Mr. Deise suggested that the present rule be amended to prohibit outside work activities for all city employees.

Mr. Wright stated that the present rule has proven unworkable because of previous abuses and thereupon moved that Rule XX be amended to read as follows:

RULE XX: NO OFFICER OR EMPLOYEE HOLDING A POSITION WITH THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO SHALL ACCEPT ANY EMPLOYMENT, POSITION, OR SERVICE OUT OF SERVICE OF THE SACRAMENTO MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT FOR WHICH HE IS COMPENSATED IN ANY FORM, INCLUDING SALARY, WAGE, FEE OR COMMISSION. PART TIME EMPLOYEES SHALL NOT BE SUBJECT TO THESE RULES.

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Seconded by Mr. Deise and unanimously carried.

In accordance with the foregoing rule, it was the order of the Board that all existing permits automatically expire October 1, 1955, unless normally expiring prior to said date and that the operation of the foregoing rule prohibiting city employees from accepting any outside employment become effective immediately.
