

RESOLUTION NO. 2006-811

Adopted by the Sacramento City Council

November 9, 2006

AWARD THE CONTRACT TO THE LOWEST RESPONSIBLE BIDDER FOR THE INITIAL PURCHASE OF FIVE DUMP TRUCKS, IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$400,000 AND AUTHORIZE THE CITY MANAGER OR HIS DESIGNEE TO EXECUTE A THREE YEAR CONTRACT FOR THE PURCHASE OF UP TO 15 DUMP TRUCKS WITH SACRAMENTO TRUCK CENTER WITH A TOTAL CONTRACT AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$1.2 MILLION.

BACKGROUND

- A. The Department of General Services has a current requirement for the purchase of dump trucks at \$80,000 each. Other City departments may also have a need to replace or purchase up to ten additional dump trucks; therefore, this bid has provisions to allow for those additional purchases at the current bid price, including cost escalation provisions (up to 5% per year) within the next three years.
- C. In August 2006 the City issued a formal invitation to bid, Bid No. B061181074 for five dump trucks. Three bidders responded. The lowest responsible bidder is Sacramento Truck Center.
- D. The City Council has adopted a policy of fuel strategies to improve air quality (Resolution 2005-454).

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The contract is awarded to the Sacramento Truck Center for the initial purchase of five dump trucks, in an amount not to exceed \$400,000, with a total contract amount not to exceed \$1.2 million.
- Section 2. The City Manager or his designee is authorized to execute a three year contract with Sacramento Truck Center, 100 Opportunity Street, Sacramento, CA for up to fifteen dump trucks in an amount not to exceed \$1.2 million.


