### RECOMMENDATION:

This report recommends that the City Council adopt the attached Resolution which authorizes the execution of Supplemental Agreement No. 2 to City Manager Agreement No. 2001-896 with International Telecommunications Consultants Inc. (ITC) for continued Municipal Fire Alarm Systems support services at a cost not-to-exceed \$125,000 and amends the Information Technology Department's FY 03 operating budget by \$125,000.

#### **SUMMARY:**

This report recommends that the City Council approve attached Resolution which authorizes the execution of Supplemental Agreement No. 2 to City Manager Agreement No. 2001-896 with International Telecommunications Consultants Inc. (ITC) for continued support for the Municipal Fire Alarm Systems through Fiscal Year 03 for an amount not-to-exceed \$125,000. In addition, this report recommends the augmentation of the Information Technology Department's

Fiscal Year 03 operating budget by \$125,000 for the funding of this Supplement No. 2 to City Manager Agreement No. 2001-896.

### **BACKGROUND:**

- In October 2001, the City of Sacramento entered an agreement with International Telecommunications Consultants Inc.(ITC) to assist the Information Technology Department's Network Services Division relating to engineering and construction of, as well as, the re-routing and rearrangement of the City's Municipal Fire Alarm Systems (MFAS) due to requests from Regional Transit and CalTrans. This City Manager Agreement No. 2001-896 was for an amount not-to-exceed \$80,000.
- On April 30, 2002, the City Council authorized the execution of Supplement No. 1 to City Manager Agreement No. 2001-896 with ITC in the amount of \$30,000 for continued services related to MFAS projects.
- Due to city staff and consultant workload related to the necessity of re-routing the MFAS for Regional Transit and CalTrans projects, it is necessary to continue the outside technical support being provided by ITC.

## FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

At the time the Information Technology Department's FY 03 Budget was adopted, the Revenue Budget portion included the \$125,000 that the City expects to receive from outside agencies, such as Regional Transit and CalTrans, for MFAS work performed by ITC on behalf of the City, at the request of these outside agencies. However, the Expenditure Budget did not include the offsetting \$125,000 that is needed to fund the Supplement No. 2 to City Manager Agreement No. 2001-896 with ITC for their services related to the MFAS. Approval of the attached Resolution by the City Council will rectify this situation and will allow these funds to be encumbered for this Supplemental Agreement with ITC.

The current not-to-exceed amount with ITC for MFAS is \$110,000. Approval of this Supplement No. 2 will increase that not-to-exceed amount to \$235,000.

#### **ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS:**

Ongoing administrative and maintenance activities, which are not made for purposes of a public work construction project, do not constitute a "project" and are exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). (CEQA Guidelines, Sections 15061(b)(1), 153778(b)(3).
