

RESOLUTION No. 95

Adopted by The Sacramento City Council on date of

October 11th, 1934

WHEREAS, the Black-McKellar Air Mail Act will deprive the United Air Lines of its present north and south mail contract on the Pacific Coast, and

WHEREAS, the City of Sacramento maintains a municipally owned airport, considerable revenue of which is derived from said United Air Lines in maintaining its Seattle-San Diego air mail route; and

WHEREAS, the loss of this revenue would seriously impair the City in its maintenance of said airport,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

That this Council request its Representatives in Congress and the Senators from California to ask for the repeal of said Act so far as same relates to the said air mail route.

BE IT RESOLVED FURTHER that copies of this resolution be sent to the Honorable Frank H. Buck, Representative in Congress from this District, and to Senators Hiram W. Johnson and Wm. G. McAdoo.
