The Civil Service Board of the City of Sacramento met in special session on the above date at 1:35 o'clock P. M. in their office Room 106 City Hall, President Chenu presiding.

PRESENT: Commissioners Mason, Weisman & Chenu  
ABSENT: None

Minutes of special meeting of January 19th were read and approved.

Mr. Bertill Nelson requested the Board to be allowed to drop the charges he had brought at meeting of January 19th, 1929, involving former Harbormaster and others.

On motion by Commissioner Weisman, seconded by Commissioner Mason, request was denied.

Chairman then ordered the hearing to proceed. Secretary read the letter signed by Mr. Nelson upon which the hearing was based.

The Chairman then called upon the following witnesses for testimony concerning the charges, after explaining that they were expected to testify upon their honor and would not be placed under oath.

Upon completion of hearing, Secretary was instructed to have testimony typed and presented to the Board for further consideration, on motion of Commissioner Mason seconded by Commissioner Weisman.

Communication was received from Francis Schwander, Laborer at City Incinerator, requesting reclassification from Laborer to Stationary Fireman. This request was accompanied by a letter from F. A. Hobson, Foreman, stating that Mr. Schwander is a very capable man and thoroughly understands the operation of Steam Boilers.

Upon motion by Commissioner Mason seconded by Commissioner Weisman, Secretary was instructed to classify Mr. Schwander as Stationary Fireman as of June 1, 1928.

Upon motion by Commissioner Mason seconded by Commissioner Weisman, the amendments spread upon the minutes of January 19, 1929 to be added to Rule 5, Section 4; Rule 5, Section 10; and Rule 5, Section 7½ were adopted.

Communication was received from Mr. R. A. Stevenson recommending that the Board make examination for classification "Filtration Plant Operators" a

promotional test, candidate to have had at least 3 months actual experience as "Mechanic" at the Sacramento Filtration Plant before being eligible for said examination.

Upon motion of Commissioner Weisman, seconded by Commissioner Mason, the recommendation was adopted.

After considerable discussion, the Board instructed the Secretary to classify all employees who had one year service as of June 1, 1928 to the positions held as of that date.

Mr. Stevenson, Superintendent Filtration Plant, requested the Board to reclassify Geo. Mansfield as Mechanic instead of Foreman.

Upon motion of Commissioner Mason seconded by Commissioner Weisman, this request was laid over until next meeting.

Communication from Carl M. Hoskinson, relative to coordination of efficient plant operation at Sumps and Water Works with rules and regulations of this Board, was laid over until next meeting upon motion by Commissioner Weisman, seconded by Commissioner Mason.

Meeting adjourned at 4:40 o'clock P.M. to meet again January 29, 1929 at 7:30 o'clock P.M.
