Subject: Recommendation of Bid Award for NORTH ONE-HALF OF FOLSOM BLVD.
EAST OF NOTRE DAME

SUMMARY:

The City Engineer's office has prepared plans and specifications for the subject project and advertised for bids. Bids have been received and the City Engineer hereby recommends bid award.

BACKGROUND:

On December 11, 1979, the City Council approved plans and specifications for North One-Half of Folsom Blvd., East of Notre Dame. Bids were received and opened by the City Clerk in the Council Chambers on January 2, 1980. Bids received are as follows:

Warren Construction	\$11,863.00
R. D. Engineering	12,554.00
Dig-It Engineering & Construction Co., Inc.	14,100.00
Lubenko Construction Co.	14,720.00
C. C. Young Construction	15,520.00
Parrish, Inc.	16,440.00

Arnold Zinankhuze	24,662.00

The Engineer's estimate for the above project was \$11,140. The low bid of Warren Construction in the amount of \$11,863.00 is 6.49% above the Engineer's estimate.

FINANCIAL DATA:

The total project cost estimate is approximately \$14,500. There is approximately \$85,000 remaining in the 1979/80 Sewer Fund budget for Miscellaneous Improvements. It is recommended that \$14,500 be transferred to this project.


RECOMMENDATION:
