**APPROVING GRANT APPLICATION FOR \$303,068 TO THE AREA 4
AGENCY ON AGING FOR TRIPLE R ADULT DAY PROGRAM**

BACKGROUND

- A. The Triple-R Adult Day Program provides respite, recreation and resources for families and older adults with Alzheimer's Disease or other forms of dementia. The program provides respite for families taking care of an older adult experiencing memory loss or frailty, recreation and socialization for older adults in a group setting, and resources for families and communities, including free support groups and a multimedia library.
- B. The California Legislature established the Alzheimer's Day Care Resource Center (ADCRC) Program in 1984.
- C. The Triple-R Adult Day Center became Sacramento's first ADCRC through a competitive process in 1999, and was re-designated through the same process in 2002.
- D. Total grant amount available is \$303,068 to be distributed to the City in four annual amounts of \$75,767.

RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:**

Section 1. Approves the filing of a grant application for \$303,068 to the Area 4 Agency on Aging for the Triple R Adult Day Program.
