

RESOLUTION No. 47

Adopted by The Sacramento City Council on date of

WHEREAS, H. R. 9282 (Tatgenhorst) proposes to place under Federal control the entire matter of stream pollution and grant the Chief of Engineers, United States Army, unlimited discretionary power to wholly prohibit any discharge into any stream from any mine, factory or other establishment; and

WHEREAS, mining in California is now being regulated out of existence with no appreciable gain to the public; and

WHEREAS, said Bill, if enacted into law, would place wholly under the control and supervision of the Army, all matters relating to sewage disposal in the State; and

WHEREAS, the State of California, through its power departments, is administering the problem of stream pollution in this State with satisfactory results and is fully competent to continue that work without any federal interference;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of Sacramento is unqualifiedly opposed to H. R. 9282, as being an unwarranted and arbitrary interference with the internal affairs of this State, and unnecessary for any purpose whatever; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Senators and Representatives in Congress from California be requested to endeavor to have added to said Bill a proviso excepting this State from its provisions; and be it further

RESOLVED, that copies of this Resolution be forwarded each Senator and Representative in Congress from California, to Governor C. C. Young, to the Department of Natural Resources of this State, to the California League of Municipalities.
