MINUTES

Edward Williams, Transportation Assistant Civil Engineer, gave an overview of the report recommending approval of a resolution to eliminate parking on the north side of San Juan Road from the overhead transmission line east of Zenobia Way to Tumbleweed Way. He explained that this would be necessary to accommodate the revised roadway striping of San Juan Road to include an additional lane in each direction (east and westbound).

In response to a question from Committee Member Fargo, Mr. Williams advised the Committee that staff had attained neighborhood awareness, and there were concerns that this action might mean removal of on-street parking from the north side of the roadway. It was explained that no regularly used parking spaces and no homes

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which front on San Juan Road on the north side of this roadway segment would be affected by this action.

It was **MOVED** by Committee member Fargo and **SECONDED** by Committee member Kastanis to approve staff recommendation and forward the report to Council. The motion carried as noted above.

Felix Luna, Police Commander, briefed the Committee on the Anti-Drug Special Enforcement activity of the Police Department, in response to Committee Members Kastanis and Ferris who requested a report back regarding the results of current efforts by the Patrol Division to reduce problems in certain neighborhoods.


Mr. Luna identified three neighborhoods as being drug "hot spots." He reported that in addition to the traditional police patrol, staff experimented with several innovative tactics including more than 1500 community contacts made, encouraging landlords to evict tenants engaged in illegal activity, inspecting property for building, health, fire violations, and changing the watering schedule of parks to dissuade loiterers drugs dealings.

Committee Member Fargo questioned the results of the areas after the special task force completed their assignment. Mr. Luna explained that after the area is restored the department enforces a maintenance program to discourage the return of any drug related activity.

Committee Member Robie questioned how the department determined the "hot spots". Mr. Luna explained that it was based upon police records, citizens' complaints, and where the officers were spending the majority of their time.

Committee Member Kastanis commended the Police department in their efforts and success and moved to receive and file the report.

The meeting was adjourned by Chair Serna at 1:49 p.m.
