SUBJECT: Agreement with the Sacramento Regional County Sanitation District Regarding the Operation and Maintenance of the Combined Wastewater Control System and Natomas Area Pump Stations and Ownership Transfer of Certain Facilities

SUMMARY:

It is recommended that the City Council authorize the City Manager to execute an agreement with the Sacramento Regional County Sanitation District regarding the operation and maintenance of the Combined Wastewater Control System and Natomas Area Pump Stations and ownership transfer of certain facilities.

BACKGROUND:

In accordance with the provisions of the Master Interagency Agreement, the Regional District is currently constructing the Combined Wastewater Control System (CWCS) and the Natomas Interceptor System (NIS). The agreement provides for the City of Sacramento to operate and maintain the CWCS facilities after construction is completed. The City has an immediate and direct interest in the proper operation of the stormwater control system to prevent flooding in the downtown area. The CWCS facilities also handle dry weather wastewater pumping for much of the City service area. Currently many of the existing facilities which are being built or modified are operated by the City for the District under terms of an interim operating agreement.

A portion of the Natomas Interceptor System work involves modification of five existing City pumping plants. Two of these plants will be used solely for pumping wastewater from City service areas; one will be abandoned and two will become part of an emergency bypass system described as Mode 2 operation. Mode 2 operation is designed to allow a temporary diversion of flow from the Arden Pump Station to facilitate repair or maintenance of that station on its force main across the American River.

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The two pumping units used for full time wastewater pumping and the abandoned station will be owned by the City and the City will be responsible for operations and maintenance. Ownership of the two stations on standby for Mode 2 operation will remain with the District. Operations and maintenance responsibility for these two stations will be handled by County forces for the Regional District.

The proposed agreement covers transfer of those facilities being returned to City ownership, the lease of those facilities being operated by the City for the District, the definition of responsibility for the costs of maintenance and operations, the allocation of costs for those facilities handling both sanitary flows and stormwater and a number of items on operational interfaces.

The agreement has been reviewed and approved as to form by the City Attorney.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the City Council authorize the City Manager to execute the agreement by passage of the attached resolution.
