

Sacramento, California,

July 1, 1929.

The Civil Service Board of the City of Sacramento met in special session on the above date at 8:00 o'clock P. M. in their office, Room 106 City Hall, President Chenu presiding.

PRESENT: Commissioners Mason, Weisman, and Chenu.
ABSENT : None.

The minutes of the special meeting of June 20th were read and approved as read.

The amendment to Rule 2 Section 3, spread upon the minutes of the meeting of June 20th in conformity with Rule 10 Section 4, was discussed by the Board and upon motion by Commissioner Mason, seconded by Commissioner Weisman, and unanimously carried, was further amended and spread upon the minutes in conformity with Rule 10 Section 4 to read as follows:

RESOLVED, that Rule 2 Section 3 be amended to read as follows:

All applicants for employment with the City of Sacramento before being accepted and placed on the eligible list will be examined physically by the City Physician, Emergency Surgeon, or Health Officer exclusive of Police Officers and Firemen. This examination will be sufficiently thorough as to reveal any physical disability or mental defect that would render the applicants undesirable as an employee, and in addition a reexamination shall be required before certification to employment.

The examination paper of James E. Cline for Junior Clerk was thoroughly reviewed by the Board, and upon motion by Commissioner Weisman, seconded by Commissioner Mason, and unanimously carried, it was the sense of the Board that James E. Cline's examination paper should stand as originally corrected.

Upon motion by Commissioner Weisman, seconded by Commissioner Mason, and unanimously carried, applications taken for the examination for Assistant Building Inspector after the closing date, and pending acceptance of such applications by the Board, were rejected. It was the sense of the Board that no precedent should be established with regard to late applications.

The case of J. Herman, pending before this Board for some time, was given a thorough review by the Board and upon motion by Commissioner Mason, seconded by Commissioner Weisman, and unanimously carried, Mr. Herman's request for reinstatement in the employ of the City of Sacramento was denied.

The Board next proceeded with the review of examination papers for Collector and opened the envelopes to establish the identification of candidates. The Personal Fitness Test for this examination was set by the Board for 7:30 o'clock P.M. on Friday, July 5, 1929.

The new Civil Service form was again presented to the Board for inspection and upon motion by Commissioner Mason, seconded by Commissioner Weisman, and unanimously carried, this form was adopted by the Board to supersede Form 99 - C S.

There being no further business, adjournment was taken at 10:30 o'clock P.M. to meet again Wednesday, July 3, 1929, at 7:00 o'clock P.M.
