

Resolution of Intention No. 2475

Pursuant to the authority of an Act of the Legislature of the State of California, known as the "Improvement Act of 1911," ~~approved April 7th, 1911, and the several Acts amendatory thereof,~~ being Division 7 of the Streets and Highways Code; It is hereby resolved that it is the intention of the City Council of the City of Sacramento to order the following street work to be done, to-wit:

The improvement of the following in the City of Sacramento:

SUTTER WAY, from the westerly boundary of "Swanston Palms Unit No. 3" (as the same is shown on the official map or plat thereof filed in the office of the County Recorder of the County of Sacramento, State of California), to the pavement in place at the easterly boundary of said "Swanston Palms Unit No. 3;" by removing and disposing of all surplus and refuse material; constructing concrete curb and gutter and concrete sidewalk; installing cast iron gutter drains, and connecting same to sewer system with vitrified ironstone sewer pipe; constructing vitrified ironstone pipe sewer; constructing concrete manhole complete with cast iron curb and cover; reconstructing existing manholes by placing curbs and covers to grade; placing street monuments; placing 2"x 6" Oregon Pine headerboards; grading; and constructing an asphaltic concrete pavement five and one-half ($5\frac{1}{2}$) inches in thickness;

SAN LUIS COURT, from the southerly line of Sutter Way, to the pavement in place approximately 225 feet southerly therefrom; by removing and disposing of all surplus and refuse material; constructing concrete curb and gutter and concrete sidewalk; placing street monument; grading; and constructing an asphaltic concrete pavement five and one-half ($5\frac{1}{2}$) inches in thickness;

MUIR WAY, from the southerly line of Sutter Way, to the pavement in place approximately 108 feet southerly therefrom; by removing and disposing of all surplus and refuse material; constructing concrete curb and gutter and concrete sidewalk; grading; and constructing an asphaltic concrete pavement five and one-half ($5\frac{1}{2}$) inches in thickness; and

The following RIGHT-OF-WAYS, owned by the City of Sacramento, in said "Swanston Palms Unit No. 3," to-wit: Along the rear of Lots 1 to 5, both inclusive; along the rear of Lots 12, 13 and 14; and along the line common to Lots 20 and 21; by removing and disposing of all surplus and refuse material; constructing concrete manhole complete with cast iron curb and cover; and constructing vitrified ironstone pipe sewer.

All of said work shall be done in accordance with the detailed plans therefor adopted by the City Council and now on file in the office of the City Engineer, and also in accordance with the "Standard Specifications for the Improvement of Streets and Alleys and for the Construction of Sewers," heretofore adopted by the said City Council.

Concrete curb and gutter shall conform with Cut No. 13 of said specifications.

Expansion joints in curb and gutter and concrete sidewalk shall be 3/8" in thickness placed every 20 feet.

Gutter drains shall conform with Cut No. 11 of said specifications.

Manhole curbs and covers shall conform with Cut No. 1 of said specifications.

Sewer joints shall be made with G-K Compound, in accordance with said specifications.

Asphaltic concrete pavement shall be constructed as provided in Section 22 of said specifications.

Flusher branch shall be in accordance with Cut No. 15 of said specifications; and

WHEREAS, the said City Council did, on December 19, 1941, pass a resolution determining the initial view of said City Council to be that the debt limitation would not be exceeded; and, thereafter, the City Clerk mailed notices to all parties interested, as required by law; and, thereafter, and before the date of January 9, 1942, the owners of 100% of the area of the district to be assessed returned a card stating that they do not demand the making of the investigation as provided by Division 4 of the Streets and Highways Code, the "Special Assessment Investigation, Limitation and Majority Protest Act of 1931;" and, thereafter, the City Council passed its resolution determining the computation of demands for investigation, as provided in said act;

And whereas, in the opinion of said City Council said work is of more than local and ordinary public benefit, said Council hereby orders that the costs and expenses of said work and improvement shall be chargeable and charged upon a district of lands, which district is hereby declared to be the district benefited by said work and improvement and which is to be assessed to pay the costs and expenses thereof.

The exterior boundaries of said district and the extent of the territory included therein are shown upon the map of said district adopted and approved by the City Council on December 19, 1941, which map is now on file in the office of the City Engineer and to which reference is hereby made for a particular description of the boundaries of said district and of the extent of the territory included therein;

Saving and excepting from the above bounden and described district the area of all public streets, alleys, ways, boulevards, courts and avenues included therein.

Notice is hereby given that serial bonds to represent unpaid assessments and bear interest at the rate of five (5%) per cent per annum will be issued hereunder in the manner provided by the "Improvement Bond Act of 1915," the last installment of which bonds shall mature ~~sixteen~~ ^{fourteen (14)} years from the second day of July next succeeding ten (10) months from their date.

All persons objecting to said work, or to the extent of said assessment district, are required to file their objections in writing in the office of the City Clerk of the City of Sacramento, as required by law, and notice is hereby given to all persons interested that on the 30th day of January, 1942, at 8:15 o'clock p. m., in the Council Chamber of the City Council of the City of Sacramento, in the City Hall, on "I" Street, between 9th and 10th Streets, in said City, any and all persons having any objections to the proposed work and improvement may appear before said City Council and show cause why the proposed work and improvement shall not be carried out in accordance with this Resolution.

And the City Clerk is hereby directed to publish this Resolution twice in the "Sacramento Union", a daily newspaper, as required by law.

RESOLUTION DETERMINING COMPUTATION OF
DEMANDS FOR INVESTIGATION NO. 2475

WHEREAS, after proceedings duly had and taken by Resolution of Preliminary Determination No. 2475, adopted by the City Council on December 19, 1941, under and pursuant to the provisions of ~~Section 15~~ the "Special Assessment Investigation, Limitation and Majority Protest Act of 1931," this City Council has determined and declared its initial view to be that the contemplated improvement described in said Resolution No. 2475 is one in which the probable assessments will not exceed the limitation set up by said act; and

WHEREAS, the Clerk of this City Council has given notice of the contemplated action of this City Council in the time, form and manner provided by ~~Section 15~~ said act above referred to, and has executed and filed an affidavit showing full compliance with the provisions of ~~Section 15~~ said act; and

WHEREAS, 100% of the owners of the lands within said district have returned cards, stating that they do not demand the making of the investigation as provided in said Special Assessment Investigation Act;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

That the number of return postcards received in response to said notice, having been computed and tabulated, as a result thereof it is hereby found and determined that the owners of less than 15% of the total area of lands proposed to be assessed for the proposed improvement described in said Resolution No. 2475 have demanded the making of the investigation provided for under the "Special Assessment Investigation, Limitation and Majority Protest Act of 1931."


