AND PUBLIC PLACES IN THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO, AND TO MAINTAIN GOOD ORDER THEREIN;  
FIXING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION OF THE PROVISIONS OF THE ORDINANCE; AND REPEAL-
