RESOLUTION NO. 339

ADOPTED BY THE SACRAMENTO CITY COUNCIL ON DATE OF NOVEMBER 13, 1945, DECLARING CAN-VASS OF REGULAR AND CONSOLIDATED MUNICIPAL ELECTION HELD NOVEMBER 6, 1945.

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WHEREAS, pursuant to the Charter of the City of Sacramento and in accordance with Resolution No. 308 of the City Council of said City adopted October 5, 1945, a regular municipal election was held in the City of Sacramento on date of November 6, 1945; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 294, adopted by the City Council on date of September 24, 1945 said Council directed the submission of certain proposed Charter amendments to the electors of said City at a special election, which special election was by Resolution No. 295 adopted by the City Council on date of September 24, 1945, consolidated with said regular municipal election; and

WHEREAS, by Ordinance No. 1065 (Fourth Series) adopted October 5, 1945, the City Council ordered submitted to the electors of said City, at a special election to be called and held for that purpose, nine (9) propositions for the incurring of bonded indebtedness and in and by said ordinance consolidated said special municipal bond election with said regular municipal election; and

WHEREAS, said regular and consolidated election was duly held on Tuesday, November 6, 1945, in accordance with law and the votes thereat received and canvassed, and the returns thereof ascertained, determined and declared in all respects as required by law, and the City Clerk of said City has duly filed with this City Council a statement of the result of said election,

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, DETERMINED  
AND DECLARED by the City Council of the City of Sacramento,  
as follows:

1. - That the statement of the City Clerk of the City of Sacramento now on file with the City Council be, and the same is hereby approved and adopted and is hereby entered on the minutes of this City Council as a statement of the result of said Regular and Consolidated Municipal Election.

2. - That the whole number of votes cast in said City at said Regular and Consolidated Municipal Election was 24,148.

That more than two-thirds of all of the votes cast at said Regular and Consolidated Municipal Election on Bond Prop-  
ositions Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 6, 9, respectively



were in favor of said propositions and authorized the incurring of a bonded indebtedness for the purpose set forth in each of said propositions so numbered, and that each of said propositions so numbered carried. That Bond Propositions Nos. 5,  
~~7 and 8 respectively~~ failed to carry.
