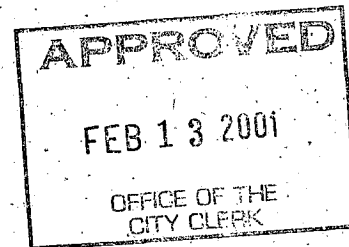

**SUMMARY:**

The City Council, through three previous actions, has approved the acceptance of a total of \$630,000 for the development of a Metropolitan Medical Response System (MMRS). An amendment to the contract for the development of the MMRS has been issued which extends the completion date and delineates the payment dates associated with contract.

**BACKGROUND:**

The City Council approved the acceptance of \$630,000 for the development of a MMRS. The MMRS is being developed to provide a local response to the health and medical consequence of a nuclear, chemical, and biological terrorist incident. The amendment to the contract extends the date for the completion to January 31, 2002. Additionally, the amendment identifies a specific payment schedule associated with work completed. Amendment is available for review in the City Clerk's office.

**FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:**

There are no matching funds required for this contract. The amendment delineates the payment schedule and will allow for better planning for purchases associated with the contract.

**ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS:**

This report proposes no changes in the existing Emergency Medical Services and Hazardous Materials operations.

**ESBD EFFORTS:**



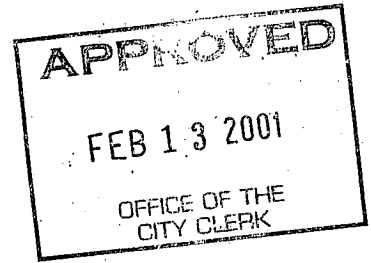
