

RESOLUTION No. 1065

Adopted by The Sacramento City Council on date of

December 8, 1939.

WHEREAS, the City Council did, on November 3rd 1939, pass and adopt a resolution of intention No. 2381 to discontinue and abandon a tract of land purchased as a park which was therein described and which is hereafter described, and which said resolution set December 8, 1939 as the day of hearing and final action thereon, and

WHEREAS, on December 8, 1939, the matter came on regularly for hearing and final action and no person appearing to protest the said abandonment; and the City Attorney having filed an affidavit of publication and an affidavit of posting in full accordance with the said resolution; and having produced witnesses as follows:

Jas. S. Dean, City Manager, who after being sworn testified that the said tract of land is not appropriate, convenient or necessary for park purposes; that same has never been used for park purposes; that no consideration has been paid for said tract of land herein described, except by said City of Sacramento; and also that no public funds have been expended to improve the same as a park, and

The hearing having been closed, and the City Council, after having considered the evidence, finds that said tract of land is not appropriate, convenient or necessary for a park; that same has not been used by the public for park purposes; that no consideration has been paid therefor except by said City of Sacramento; and that no public funds have been expended to improve the same as a park.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:


That said tract of land be abandoned as a park and for park purposes as provided and authorized by Chapter 1107 of the Statutes of 1939, State of California.

Said tract of land hereinabove abandoned as a park is situate in the City of Sacramento, County of Sacramento, State of California, and described as follows:

Bounded on the north by "M" Street; on the west by 51st Street; on the south by "Brier Terrace" (as shown on the official map or plat thereof on file in the office of the Recorder of Sacramento County); on the east by Rodeo Way; being approximately the south 134.8 feet of Lot No. 12 and all of Lot No. 11 of "Philip Wolf Jr Tract", (as shown on the official map or plat thereof on file in the office of the Recorder of Sacramento County).
