

ORDINANCE NO 1085 , FOURTH SERIES.

AN ORDINANCE CALLING A SPECIAL ELECTION IN THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE ELECTORS OF SAID CITY SEVERAL PROPOSITIONS FOR INCURRING BONDED INDEBTEDNESS OF SAID CITY FOR THE ACQUISITION, CONSTRUCTION AND COMPLETION OF THE FOLLOWING MUNICIPAL IMPROVEMENTS, TO WIT: (1) SEWER IMPROVEMENT, (2) WATER SUPPLY, (3) FIRE PROTECTION, (4) STREET WORK, (5) CROCKER ART GALLERY, (6) PARK AND PLAYGROUND, (7) SWIMMING POOL, (8) MAIN LIBRARY ADDITION, AND (9) CORPORATION YARD; DECLARING THE ESTIMATED COST OF SAID MUNICIPAL IMPROVEMENTS, AND EACH THEREOF, THE AMOUNT OF THE PRINCIPAL OF SAID INDEBTEDNESS TO BE INCURRED FOR EACH THEREOF, AND THE MAXIMUM RATE OF INTEREST TO BE PAID THEREON; MAKING PROVISION FOR THE LEVY AND COLLECTION OF TAXES; FIXING THE DATE OF SAID ELECTION, THE MANNER OF HOLDING THE SAME, PROVIDING FOR NOTICE THEREOF AND CONSOLIDATING SAID SPECIAL ELECTION WITH THE REGULAR MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD IN SAID CITY ON NOVEMBER 6, 1945.

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WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Sacramento, by resolution duly passed and adopted at a special meeting of said Council on the 4th day of October, 1945, by affirmative vote of more than two-thirds of all of its members, did determine that the public interest and necessity demand the acquisition, construction and completion of the municipal improvements hereinafter mentioned, and each of them, and did further determine the cost of each of said proposed municipal improvements will be too great to be paid out of the ordinary

annual income and revenue of said municipality, which resolution was duly entered on the minutes of said Council and by ayes and noes recorded in its journal of proceedings and authenticated by the signature of the presiding officer of said Council and by the City Clerk, and is now on file and of record in the City Clerk's office of said City; now, therefore,

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO,

as follows:

Section 1. - That a special municipal election be, and is hereby ordered and will be held in said City of Sacramento on Tuesday, the 6th day of November, 1945, at which election shall be submitted to the qualified electors of said City the several questions of incurring bonded indebtedness of said City for the objects and purposes set forth in the following propositions, and each of them, as follows, to wit:

PROPOSITION NO. 1: Shall the City of Sacramento  
(Sewer Improvement) incur a bonded indebtedness in the principal amount of \$2,000,000 for the object and purpose of acquiring, constructing and completing the following municipal improvement, to wit: Improvement of the municipal sewage disposal system, including trunk sewers, connecting sewers, pipes, culverts, inlets, catch basins, pumps, machinery, easements and other works, property or structures necessary or convenient for sewage disposal purposes of the City of Sacramento?

PROPOSITION NO. 2: Shall the City of Sacramento  
(Water Supply) incur a bonded indebtedness in the principal amount of \$500,000 for the object and purpose of acquiring, constructing and completing the following municipal improvement, to wit: Improvement of the municipal water system, including extension of water distribution facilities, pipes, pipe lines, pumping equipment and other works, property or structures necessary or convenient for improving the municipal water system of the City of Sacramento?

PROPOSITION NO. 3: Shall the City of Sacramento  
(Fire Protection) incur a bonded indebtedness in the principal amount of \$55,000 for the object and purpose of acquiring, constructing and completing the following municipal improvement, to wit: Improvement of the municipal fire protection system, including new fire station and extension of fire alarm signal system and other works, property or structures necessary or convenient for the fire protection system of the City of Sacramento?

PROPOSITION NO. 4:  
(Street Work)

Shall the City of Sacramento incur a bonded indebtedness in the principal amount of \$300,000 for the object and purpose of acquiring, constructing and completing the following municipal improvement, to wit: Street work, including the improvement of streets and public ways, the widening, enlarging, extending, straightening, grading, paving and surfacing of streets, sidewalks, curbs, embankments and retaining walls, street lighting facilities, traffic signals and other works, property or structures necessary or convenient for the improvement of the public street system of the City of Sacramento?

PROPOSITION NO. 5:  
(Crocker Art Gallery)

Shall the City of Sacramento incur a bonded indebtedness in the principal amount of \$180,000 for the object and purpose of acquiring, constructing and completing the following municipal improvement, to wit: Fireproof addition to Crocker Art Gallery for the housing, preservation and displaying of art treasures, statuary, sculptures, paintings and other valuable works of art entrusted to the custody of the E. B. Crocker Art Gallery of the City of Sacramento?

PROPOSITION NO. 6:  
(Park and Playground)

Shall the City of Sacramento incur a bonded indebtedness in the principal amount of \$50,000 for the object and purpose of acquiring, constructing and completing the following municipal improvement, to wit: New public park, playground and recreation center to be located in the southeasterly portion of the City of Sacramento in the vicinity of Tahoe School, including land, playground and recreational equipment and apparatus and other works, property or structures necessary or convenient for park and playground purposes of the City of Sacramento?

PROPOSITION NO. 7:  
(Swimming Pool)

Shall the City of Sacramento incur a bonded indebtedness in the principal amount of \$100,000 for the object and purpose of acquiring, constructing and completing the following municipal improvement, to wit: A municipal swimming pool and aquatic gymnasium in Southside Park, including water treatment facilities, buildings, equipment, apparatus and other works, property or structures necessary or convenient for municipal swimming pool purposes of the City of Sacramento?

PROPOSITION NO. 8:  
(Main Library  
Addition)

Shall the City of Sacramento incur a bonded indebtedness in the principal amount of \$85,000 for the object and purpose of acquiring, constructing and completing the following municipal improvement, to wit: Addition to the Main Library Building of the City, including fixtures, apparatus and equipment and other works, property or structures necessary or convenient for the relief of the over-crowded condition of the present main library building?

PROPOSITION NO. 9:  
(Corporation Yard)

Shall the City of Sacramento incur a bonded indebtedness in the principal amount of \$75,000 for the object and purpose of acquiring, constructing and completing the following municipal improvement, to wit: Improvement of the City Corporation Yard, including public buildings for housing and servicing municipal equipment for fire and police protection, garbage disposal equipment, street maintenance and cleaning equipment, Recreation Department equipment, Water Department equipment, and all other departmental equipment and other works, property, or structures necessary for the City Corporation Yard of the City of Sacramento?

That the estimated cost of the municipal improvement set forth in said Proposition No. 1 (Sewer Improvement) is the sum of \$2,000,000 and the amount of the indebtedness proposed to be incurred for said municipal improvement is the sum of \$2,000,000. That the estimated cost of the municipal improvement set forth in said Proposition No. 2 (Water Supply) is the sum of \$500,000 and the amount of the indebtedness proposed to be incurred for said municipal improvement is the sum of \$500,000. That the estimated cost of the municipal improvement set forth in said Proposition No. 3 (Fire Protection) is the sum of \$55,000 and the amount of the indebtedness proposed to be incurred for said municipal improvement is the sum of \$55,000. That the estimated cost of the municipal improvement set forth in said Proposition No. 4 (Street Work) is the sum of \$300,000 and the amount of the indebtedness proposed to be incurred for said municipal improvement is the sum of \$300,000. That the estimated cost of the municipal improvement set forth in said Proposition No. 5 (Crocker Art Gallery) is the sum of \$180,000 and the amount of the indebtedness proposed to be incurred for said municipal improvement is the sum of \$180,000. That the estimated cost of the municipal improvement set forth in said Proposition No. 6 (Park and Playground) is the sum of \$50,000 and the amount of the indebtedness proposed to be incurred for said municipal improvement is

the sum of \$50,000. That the estimated cost of the municipal improvement set forth in said Proposition No. 7 (Swimming Pool) is the sum of \$100,000 and the amount of the indebtedness proposed to be incurred for said municipal improvement is the sum of \$100,000. That the estimated cost of the municipal improvement set forth in said Proposition No. 8 (Main Library Addition) is the sum of \$85,000 and the amount of the indebtedness proposed to be incurred for said municipal improvement is the sum of \$85,000. That the estimated cost of the municipal improvement set forth in said Proposition No. 9 (Corporation Yard) is the sum of \$75,000 and the amount of the indebtedness proposed to be incurred for said municipal improvement is the sum of \$75,000.

Section 2. That said Council does hereby submit to the qualified electors of said City of Sacramento at said special municipal election the said propositions, and each of them, set forth in Section 1 of this ordinance, and designates and refers to said propositions in the form of ballot hereinafter prescribed for use at said election. Said Council proposes to issue and sell bonds of said City of Sacramento in the amounts and for the objects and purposes specified in said propositions, and each thereof, if two-thirds of the qualified electors voting on each separate proposition at said special municipal election shall vote in favor of each of said propositions; provided, however, that the votes cast for and against each of said respective propositions shall be counted separately and when two-thirds of the qualified electors voting on any one of such propositions vote in favor thereof, such proposition shall be deemed adopted and bonds of the City of Sacramento in the aggregate amount specified in the proposition or propositions which carried by the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the

qualified electors of said City voting on such proposition or propositions at said election shall be issued and sold for the purposes specified in the proposition or propositions which received such affirmative two-thirds vote. Said bonds shall be negotiable in form and of the character known as serial, and shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding five (5) per cent. per annum, payable semi-annually, which coupon rate shall not be exceeded in the issuance of said bonds, but may be decreased if the Council shall obtain bids for the purchase of said bonds at any lower coupon rate, and said bonds shall be offered for sale on the basis of the lowest net interest cost to the City of Sacramento. Provision is hereby made for the payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds as follows, to wit: The Council of the City of Sacramento shall, at the time of fixing the general tax levy and in the manner for such general tax levy provided, levy and collect annually each year until said bonds are paid, or until there shall be a sum in the treasury of said City set apart for that purpose to meet all sums coming due for principal and interest on such bonds, a tax sufficient to pay the annual interest on such bonds as the same becomes due, and also such part of the principal thereof as shall become due before the proceeds of a tax levied at the time for making the next general tax levy can be made available for the payment of such principal. Said tax shall be in addition to all other taxes levied for municipal purposes, and shall be collected at the same time and in the same manner as other municipal taxes are collected, and be used for no other purpose than the payment of said bonds and accruing interest.

Section 3. Said special election shall be held and conducted, and the votes thereof canvassed, and the returns

thereof made, and the result thereof ascertained and determined as herein provided; and in all particulars not prescribed by this ordinance said election shall be held as provided by law for the holding of municipal elections in said City.

Section 4. All persons qualified to vote at municipal elections in said City of Sacramento upon the date of the election herein provided for shall be qualified to vote upon the propositions, and each of them, submitted at said special election.

Section 5. The polls at the polling places hereinafter designated shall be opened at six o'clock A.M. of said day of election and shall be kept open continuously thereafter until seven o'clock P.M. of said day of election, when the polls shall be closed (except as provided in Section 5734 of the Elections Code), and the election officers shall thereupon proceed to canvass the ballots cast thereat.

Section 6. Said special municipal bond election hereby called shall be, and is hereby, consolidated with the Regular Municipal Election to be held in the City of Sacramento on the 6th day of November, 1945, which Regular Municipal Election is called by Section 185 of the Charter of the City of Sacramento and by Resolution No. 308 of said Council, entitled:

" A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE HOLDING OF THE REGULAR MUNICIPAL ELECTION IN THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO ON TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 6, 1945, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 185 OF THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO, FOR THE PURPOSE OF ELECTING NINE MEMBERS OF THE CITY COUNCIL; ESTABLISHING ELECTION PRECINCTS AND POLLING PLACES FOR SAID REGULAR ELECTION AND APPOINTING BOARDS OF ELECTION THEREFOR, AND CONSOLIDATING WITH SAID REGULAR MUNICIPAL ELECTION THE SPECIAL ELECTION CALLED BY RESOLUTION NO. 294 TO BE HELD IN SAID CITY ON NOVEMBER 6, 1945, FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING PROPOSALS FOR THE AMENDMENT OF THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO. "

adopted on the 5th day of October, 1945; and the precincts, polling places and officers of said election called hereby shall be the same as the precincts, polling places and officers for said Regular Municipal Election, and reference to said Resolution No. 308 is hereby specifically made for a designation of said precincts, polling places and officers of the election called hereby.

Section 7. The ballots to be used at said special municipal election shall, in addition to all other matters required by law, have printed thereon the following:

PROPOSITION NO. 1: Shall the City of Sacramento (Sewer Improvement) incur a bonded indebtedness in the principal amount of \$2,000,000 for the object and purpose of acquiring, constructing and completing the following municipal improvement, to wit: Improvement of the municipal sewage disposal system, including trunk sewers, connecting sewers, pipes, culverts, inlets, catch basins, pumps, machinery, easements and other works, property or structures necessary or convenient for sewage disposal purposes of the City of Sacramento?

PROPOSITION NO. 9: Shall the City of Sacramento incur a bonded indebtedness in the principal amount of \$75,000 for the object and purpose of acquiring, constructing and completing the following municipal improvement, to wit: Improvement of the City Corporation Yard, including public buildings for housing and servicing municipal equipment for fire and police protection, garbage disposal equipment, street maintenance and cleaning equipment, Recreation Department equipment, Water Department equipment, and all other departmental equipment and other works, property, or structures necessary for the City Corporation Yard of the City of Sacramento?

Section 8. Each voter may vote on any or all of said propositions. Each voter to vote for any proposition hereby submitted and for incurring said bonded indebtedness shall stamp a cross (X) in the blank space opposite the word "YES" on the ballot to the right of said proposition, and to vote against any proposition and against incurring said indebtedness shall stamp a cross (X) in the blank space opposite the word "NO" on the ballot to the right of said proposition.

Section 9. The returns of said election shall be made out and signed by the election officers and shall be by them deposited with the City Clerk, together with the ballots cast at said election; and this Council shall meet at its usual meeting place and canvass said returns on Tuesday, the 13th day of November, 1945 (being the first Tuesday after said election) at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M., and declare the result of said election.

Section 10. The Clerk of the City of Sacramento is hereby directed upon the passage and adoption of this ordinance to publish the same once a day for seven (7) days in the SACRAMENTO UNION which is a newspaper of general circulation published seven (7) days a week in the said City of Sacramento (and the official newspaper of said City), and such publication shall constitute notice of said election. No other notice of the election hereby called need be given.


Section 11. This ordinance shall be forthwith entered upon the minutes of this Council and in the Ordinance Book of said City. This ordinance, being an ordinance calling and ordering an election, shall take effect from and after its final passage and approval.
